GUEST COLUMN – FATHER JOHN CHRISTMAN



One year ago today, on a relatively mild July 5th, my parents and myself set out for Cleveland from the Blessed Sacrament parish in Chicago. Chicago had been my home for the previous six years. Our Blessed Sacrament religious had started a new community in Chicago at Saints Peter and Paul Parish and I had been one of the founding members. At the request of the archdiocese we merged that parish with two

other local parishes. Under the untiring leadership of Father Tom Smithson, SSS the new parish, Blessed Sacrament Parish, found its footing. Over the course of those six years I studied theology, did my hospital chaplaincy program and even taught English as a second language for a time. It was also in Chicago that I first exercised my ministry as a priest.

When the time came it was not easy to leave Chicago. Although the parish community was, perhaps initially, a little cautious about having a religious community administering the parish, in time they embraced us with great kindness and generosity of spirit. It was there I met some of the nicest people I've ever known.

It was also difficult for me to leave our local religious community. We had enjoyed so many good times together. I remember fondly all the great Chicago restaurants we had discovered and all the great dinner conversations and laughter we had shared. I remember with joy the few times we went to concerts at the Chicago Theater or the Lyric Opera. I also remember the many times I took community members and guests to the wonderfully curated Art Institute of Chicago. There were so many enjoyable things about living in Chicago.

But, as I received my new assignment, I was also excited to try something new. Saint Paschal Baylon Parish is our biggest parish in the United States and I knew I would learn a lot there. Moreover, Father Lane and I had been good friends since we both lived in our community in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Likewise, there are very few people in this world that I enjoy sharing theological conversations with more than Father Paul. So, I looked forward to community life at Saint Paschal's as well.

Nevertheless, I was a little worried about being accepted. Saint Paschal's has over 2600 families. That's a lot of people. And, as it was quite obvious to everyone, I was going to be the youngest priest on staff. Add playing drums in the choir and I wasn't quite sure how I would be received.

Turns out, however, that my initial trepidations were unfounded. The people of Saint Paschal's are just as kind and generous as so many of the other parishes where I have lived and ministered. It just takes more time to get to know them because of their great numbers. It is indeed a blessing we have so many parishioners. In fact, although I've been here a year now, I still feel like I'm meeting new parishioners all the time.

But what I'd really like to do is take this opportunity to thank all of you for welcoming me to your parish. Everyone has been so very kind to me over this last year. And I must say that I am proud to be part of Saint Paschal Baylon Parish. We do so much important ministry here. I've always admired her sincerity and gentle kindness and I think those qualities were easily apparent in the words she shared. She and my father are very much looking forward to their next visit to Saint Paschal's.
