FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



EYMARD WEEKEND: Annually on August 2 and the weekend closest to the feast of our founder, Saint Peter Julian Eymard, our parish celebrates this great man of the Eucharist. Since Saint Pope John XXIII called Saint Eymard, “the apostle of the Eucharist,” it has given all of us in the church, but especially at this, a Blessed Sacrament parish a reminder that we each are called to

live and share the Eucharist. We are to be a people who give thanks to God in all we do; a people who adore God and make God first in our lives, our treasure; to be a people who pray for others; to be a people of forgiveness and mercy. May we all be apostles of the Eucharist as we spread this message of God’s love and all the facets of the Eucharistic mystery. Spend some time this week with one of the attributes of the Eucharist so that when we are canonized, they will say, s/he was “an apostle of the Eucharist.”

MORE ON ANNULMENTS: Last week in my column I shared the news that Bishop Lennon has made the process to declare a sacramental marriage invalid a free process – no payments. I wanted to elaborate more about the three different types of annulments. Most know that a Catholic marrying a Catholic is a particular “formal case,” and a lengthy process – but a healing process, as those who have gone through the year to 18 months will share. For someone who is a Christian in another tradition or rite, who marries another Christian, they must also go through a formal process. Even if someone is not Catholic, most go through a formal case. The church makes exceptions only in cases “of the favor of the faith,” when someone is not baptized. If you have further questions or would like to help someone go through the process, check out the diocesan website and the tribunal – or see Fr. John or myself to assist you in the process. We are here to assist if you would like to participate.
