FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Week 28 in Ordinary Time Begins: Thank you for accepting the invitation and joining in the great feast we are all called to as God's disciples. In a culture that values, "What's my best offer?" we hear once again that God's plan for our lives is an abundance of life and love. Can we trust God to accept the invitation with open hands and open ears and minds? It's a special journey of trust – but it is a glorious feast of life that awaits us when we do accept and put our faith into practice.

Grateful Giving: You may have received a letter from me in the mail by now announcing the "Grateful Giving Offertory Enhancement Program." This weekend at the Masses, the co-chairs of our Finance Council, Kevin Martin and Greg Buehner will be sharing the first witness talks about this extraordinary opportunity. We have a chance to evaluate our stewardship, how we share God's blessings back with God and our faith community. Thank you for accepting this invitation and prayerfully answering God's call to help us all grow in stewardship.

Updating our Church Lighting: Do not adjust your eyes! We are trying a few experimental lighting projects as we move our 43-year-old church building to the next phase of lighting. As most of you know from your home experience, lighting is radically changing and moving in a totally different and energy-saving direction. The perimeter lights around the church have been 300-watt bulbs and they are no longer available. Rather than replace the entire fixture at a tremendous cost, we are going to be replacing the inside of the fixture. For now, we are working only on the perimeter, but with the hopes of also replacing the 30-foot/crossbeam lights too. Recently, we replaced these bulbs and internal electrical items to the left of the Eymard statue and they are now using 30-watt bulbs. This will be a tremendous energy savings when complete. Secondly, you may have already noticed that the lights on the plants surround the sanctuary have been replaced with LED fixtures. Furthermore, half of the chapel lights have been replaced. We thank our Maintenance Team for working on these projects and improving our systems with cost savings items.

Praying for Richmond Heights: Many are aware that the city of Richmond Heights has had some recent dramatic challenges, with the school and city politics. The Hillcrest Ministerial Association, led by Pastor Gene McAfee at Faith United Church of Christ (next to the Mall on the east side of Richmond Road), 575 Richmond Road, will be hosting a prayer service, Sunday, October 12, 4:30 p.m. Please join in this ecumenical prayer service, with a simple reception following. Politics have divided a few -- let us have prayer unite us.

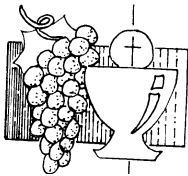

More parishioners and non-parishioners are joining in this round the clock ministry. Here are a few reminders at the end of the day:

- Please repose the Blessed Sacrament to the tabernacle, removing the luna from the monstrance and bowing before retrieving. After placing in the tabernacle, show reverence to the Blessed Sacrament. Shut the tabernacle doors and remove the key.
- Take the key, monstrance and place in the sacristy safe.
- The key goes on a special hook on the safe door.
- Blow out the candles and turn off the chapel lights

If you are unfamiliar with where items are kept, please see Deacon Joe or one of the priests and they will assist you. If no one shows up for the shift following yours, please follow these same procedures above for the protection of the Blessed Sacrament. If another person comes later in the day, please turn on the lights and light the candles. Even if we are not following the liturgical rite of exposition, the Real Presence of Christ is present and our prayer witness continues as we stay with the Lord in the chapel, present in the tabernacle.
