**HAPPY EPIPHANY AND HAPPY NEW YEAR!** Our celebration of Christmas Time continues with the solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. As we remember the Magi “who searched diligently for Christ,” may we in our new year’s resolution experience remember to keep Christ “diligently” in our days; may we also recognize each day for the gift it is – and share a gift of ourselves with others. We then bring Christ to others – helping our world become more Christlike, more like Christmas each day of the year.

**HOUSE BLESSING:** A reminder that also a custom on Epiphany and at the beginning of the new year is the custom to bless our house with holy water and chalk, writing over the door posts 20 + C + M + B + 15 (for our new year). The blessing is associated with the Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar. The blessing is found in the *Catholic Household Book of Blessings* page 91. CMB also stands for the three Latin words that mean “May Christ bless this house.” So as a family, take the time in these first two weeks of the year to say the following words and inscribe, with chalk, the numbers and letters above your door posts, sprinkle holy water in each room and say:

Lord God of heaven and earth,  
you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation  
by the guidance of a star.  
Bless this house and all who inhabit it.  
Fill them (us) with the light of Christ,  
that their (our) concern for others may reflect your love.  
We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen

May Christ Jesus dwell with us, keep us from all harm,  
and make us one in mind and heart, now and forever.

**NEW VESTMENTS:** At Saint Ann Shrine and in our parish church, we have been displaying vestment donations from Bishop Donald Pelotte, SSS and Father Dana Pelotte, SSS’s estate that we inherited. As bishop of the Diocese of Gallup, (the poorest diocese in the country) many would donate to Bishop Pelotte wonderful vestments and other liturgical items – to him and then for his distribution to churches in need throughout the southwest. Today is the 5<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his death – and so a fitting day to share with you where the vestments came from as we remember him and his life and have completed the distribution of his estate, to our province heritage room, his family members, Saint Ann Shrine and Saint Paschal Baylon. I was blessed to be Bishop Pelotte’s altar server when I grew up here at SPB – it began a life long friendship.

It was getting late but none the less the co-captain said to turn right – heading where we might find Adam. In obedience the driver turned right and to our surprise within a mile we found him. He was cold and desperate for food, a sleeping bag, warm gloves and fellowship. He was very happy to see us. The power of obedience to the Holy Spirit can only bring blessings. By the way we found the other two also later that night. Thank you Blessed Sacrament Community for sound teaching.

## NEW ONLINE DONATION PROGRAM

Online contribution refers to a process much like online bill pay, whereby donors opt to have their financial contributions to the church withdrawn directly from their **credit, debit, checking, or savings account** in lieu of bringing cash or paper checks each Sunday.

myEoffering has designed a secure, web-based platform in which donors may privately and prayerfully make one-time or recurring donations. You can customize a completely individual method of giving, based on how and when you receive your income - whether it be bi-weekly, monthly, or semi-monthly. By setting up recurring donations to be automatically debited from your account, it allows the church to better plan budgets and expenditures and provides a more accurate financial forecast. It also enables you to stay on the path of your contribution goals by ensuring that even if you are unable to attend church on a particular Sunday, you needn't worry about remembering to make that contribution the following week.
