GUEST COLUMN MUSIC MINISTRY

Why do you come to Mass? What do you do while you're here? How are you different when you leave?

Let's face it, we come to Mass for varied reasons. Some of us are here because we want to be, some because we feel that we're supposed to be, some because we were made to be and some aren't really sure of the exact reason, but we come all the same. Perhaps we come seeking mercy and grace. Perhaps we come for unity, acceptance and peace. Or, perhaps we come to give praise and thanksgiving to our great and wondrous God.

Hand in hand with whatever reasons get us through the door, we bring to this table our varied personalities, life experiences and daily realities. We bring our hopes and dreams, our faults and our failings. We bring all that we are, all that we know. We truly are many parts. And regardless of our reason for being here...we are here. And no matter what we bring with us when we come, each of us, gathered together, though many parts, by our gathering, become the Body of Christ.

So, Body of Christ...now that we're here what do we do? Fifty years ago, the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy of the Second Vatican Council expressed a desire that all the faithful should engage in "full, conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations." What exactly does that mean you may ask? Well...it could be something as simple as focusing our attention on the readings of the Mass, allowing the Word of God to penetrate our hearts and minds. Maybe it's a matter of being more attentive to the homily as the celebrant breaks open the Word for us. Perhaps we could open the hymnal and sing along with the music of the day, especially the Responsorial Psalm, which is after all the Word of God in song. Or perhaps we could memorize the modified translation of the Penitential Act or Creed so we can pray the meaning of these words instead of just reciting them. Or, even still, maybe we could work on learning one of the new Mass parts in such a way that together, as the body of Christ, we can lift our voices in a chorus of glory to God. Or at the sign of peace, maybe we can work towards a true offering of peace and reconciliation with someone in our own family, instead of just a handshake. Whatever you do while you're here, I encourage you to try something new,

offer a little more of yourself for the building up of our brothers and sisters gathered together, and to the glory of God.

Ok, Body of Christ, we read, we sang, we pondered and prayed, we gave and received, and now it's time to "go in peace to love and serve the Lord." The hope is that by our full, conscious and active participation in the Mass we are a changed people, right? The hope is that in becoming the Body of Christ, receiving the Body of Christ in the Eucharist, we go forth and bring Christ into our homes, schools, workplaces, and world. And let's face it, our world is a world in need of the Body of Christ. So...go in peace to love and serve the Lord as we feed the hungry, clothe the naked, comfort the sick and dying, visit the lonely and imprisoned. Go in peace to love and serve the Lord as we care for our family members, neighbors, co-workers and friends. Go in peace to love and serve the Lord in our actions and in the words that we speak. God in peace to love and serve the Lord in our living and in our loving until we come again to the table of the Lord to renew and refresh ourselves in the Body of Christ.
