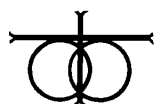

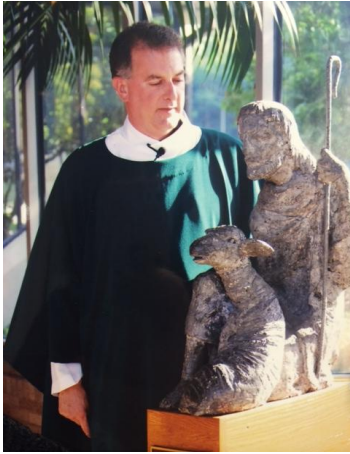

LIFE IN THE EUCHARIST PROGRAM & RETREAT DAY FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE...



21st Sunday in Ordinary Time: This is the fifth and final week we have the Gospel of John's and the sixth chapter helping us deepen our understanding of the Eucharist. Whether you have been present for the retreat days, the Triduum, or have been praying at home, I hope that this has been a valuable time for you to reflect on the "Bread of Life" and "Cup of Salvation" Jesus has given us in Body and Blood to feast on and be nourished for our daily living. Not only that, we are to become what we eat – the Body of Christ – and bring God's love to others. From the little things we do for one another, from compliments, smiles, opening a door and other courtesies, we live the Eucharist.

Community at Prayer: May I also invite you to become part of our Community at Prayer Ministry and extend the prayer of the Mass? Whether at home or in the church, we unite ourselves in a special prayer network for one another. If you would be able to devote one hour a week, we would really appreciate your help on Tuesday afternoons, 2:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. and Thursday mornings from 10:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. To sign up or let us know that you are praying at home in our CAP ministry, please contact our coordinator, Jennifer Bartlett greygerbs@sbcglobal.net or 440-864-0184.

Questions/Catechesis of the Mass – Part 5: We continue to fulfill our Pastoral Plan dream to learn more about the Eucharist and Mass with explanations of "why we do what we do." This week we reflect on standing during the Mass, especially the Communion Rite.

Every form of posture is noted in the Bible and has been part of the tradition of the church. A common posture symbolizes our togetherness and unity with God. With the 1970 *Roman Missal*, the church went back to the early church again for why we stand – the posture of the Resurrected Christ. We call this prayer position "orans," that is standing with arms extended in prayer. At one time, everyone would stand in this prayer position mimicking Christ, hoping to ascend like Christ did. The early church was concerned about standing and being ready for the LORD to come again, for we hear this especially in some of the letters of the New Testament. After Vatican II, the church wanted to better capture this key element – that we wait in joyful hope for the coming of the Savior. This is said at every Mass during the "embolism" or prayer part after the "Lord's Prayer" or "Our Father." That is why in this diocese especially, we stand (for those who are able) with our hands extended in prayer in this gesture.

For communion, again, it was recapturing the importance of reverence. For two centuries kneeling for Communion at a rail was the norm. However, the rail was not required anymore, nor kneeling after its removal. We stand – and sing – to symbolize our common unity as the Body of Christ, with Christ as the head. Have you noticed we have always stood for the proclamation of the Gospel to show reverence to Christ who is speaking to us? This is the same reason we stand for communion – being fed by God's Word and Sacrament, and showing reverence to Christ in one another. Again, this posture is for those who are physically able to do so. Thanks for observing this church rubric, adapting and changing, as Christ is always to grow in holiness and a better understanding of the Eucharistic mystery.

Volunteer Coordinator: We are so happy to welcome Michelle Mazza to the other side of the campus as our Administrative Assistant for the Parish. (She worked for the school for several years with a few parish responsibilities – her duties have now swapped.) One aspect to Michelle's job description is Volunteer Coordinator. If your group would be so kind to get a list of your group members, names, phone numbers and email addresses, this would be so helpful for her coordination as Volunteer Coordinator. Additionally, if you would like to volunteer for a specific ministry or group, contact her. She will be coordinating volunteers in many different ways as the years progress. We appreciate all the hours people tithed to God through their ministry, service and commitment to SPB and to God!

Director of Advancement: Our search committee has completed its summer work and we are now advertising for an Advancement Director for our parish. Please look to our website for the details and share the info with a candidate or two. Please pray for our parish as we prepare to welcome this new staff member to assist us with our stewardship efforts and implementation of our Pastoral Plan.

Theology on Tap: Our Young Adult Ministry, another goal of the Pastoral Plan, had a successful gathering at Mulligan's to discuss theology and have social time together. Please let other young Catholics know of this ministry – support and encourage your children and grandchildren to attend these sessions and Mass.

Summer Ending Recruitment Drive: It's time to support, affirm and encourage folks to return to regular worship of God and attend Mass to be who we say we are: The Body of Christ. Tell your family members you miss them and love them – and just like the family meal, you want to be together to begin the celebration of the family with the family of God, here at SPB. We are blessed to have a great team of musicians, preaching, hospitality and kindness. Welcome people back and begin Sunday and the week ahead in a special way that supports and nourishes our faith and life with God. Worship is a team effort! See you next Sunday! Let's continue to pray for each other!

PARISH COUNCIL CORNER - Following a July hiatus, Council began a new term with a meeting on August 3, welcoming new member John Mugnano. He is already at work with the group preparing the job description for the position of parish Director of Advancement. Members of the Spiritual Formation Committee met with Terrie Baldwin, diocesan Director of Evangelization, to learn about the process for starting small groups for weekly faith sharing. She provided a lot of sound advice and many resources to examine. Look for an announcement in September. Council continues to discuss topics from the book “Rebuilt”: establishing a greeting ministry to serve at all weekend Masses, designating a Volunteer Co-ordinator for the whole parish and evangelizing and inviting the “unchurched” into our faith community via direct mail or other means.
