Blessings This Advent!***

Blessings to you this special weekend! I pray that you have a wonderful Thanksgiving holiday. We welcome visitors and guests, some annually, who attend this Thanksgiving and make SPB home! We are grateful for your presence in our faith community. On behalf of the Blessed

Sacrament Community (SSS), the Sisters of Notre Dame (SND) and the Pastoral Staff, have a blessed time giving thanks for God's goodness. We count our blessings and are grateful to build God's kingdom here at SPB!

This is also the First Sunday of Advent and the beginning of a new liturgical year! We will be in Cycle C – the Gospel of Luke for the Sunday Gospel. The first reading and psalm during Ordinary Time are picked in harmony with the Lucan Gospel. During Advent Time, the readings help reflect on our waiting for Christ's Second Coming.

In the Gospel today, there are a few key phrases that cause us to reflect on the meaning of the season and the importance of taking the time to reflect on Advent. "Be on guard," "Be alert," "Pray that you may have the strength." These are all key for us to hold dear in our hearts as we build hope, joy and keep watch for Christ's return. Paul's letter to the Thessalonians reminds how this happens, "May the LORD make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, just as we abound in love for you." This is challenging, but he also says that we learn and do this process of loving and living to please God and support one another. May this holy season help us all grow in "lifting up our soul" to the LORD who will guide us, be on guard and alert! Alert to see and share love!!

We Did It! We Raised Enough to Build a Home in Haiti! Congratulations SPB & thank you for your continued witness of your faith. From the 2nd collection, we were able to collect enough money to have a home built in Haiti for our mission trip **February 22 – 26**. This \$3,200 does not include the individual parishioners who mailed their envelopes separately! THANK YOU-THANK YOU! Now, won't you join with us and go down to Haiti and paint this house? (We are not able to physically build a cement blockhouse in Haiti because of the physical labor issues, but we are able to paint and build other parts of this house.) Here are some details:

- \$1,150 – for hotel, meals, security and bus/taxi services in Haiti.
- Plus airfare from CLE to Fort Lauderdale.
- Plus airfare from Fort Lauderdale to Haiti on the Food for the Poor chartered plane.

Let me know soon, so that we may place our deposit. Deposit is needed by Christmas. We need a minimum of 10 more people. Thanks for prayerfully considering.

Part 18 – Why We Do What We Do at Mass: Different Lord’s Prayers? Some folks mistakenly say there is a “Catholic Our Father” and a “Protestant Our Father.” There are three versions of the “Lord’s Prayer,” and the one we recited/sing for Mass is the Matthew version of the prayer. Luke’s Gospel and a contemporary liturgical book from Matthew and Luke’s era (around 80), *The Didache*, also includes a version of the Lord’s Prayer, each differently worded and the *Didache* with a special acclamation after Jesus’ prayer. We do not know who authored the *Didache*. This book is in Greek and contains the “teachings of the apostles.” The “acclamation,” “For the kingdom the power...” is included together with Jesus’ prayer. Some have theorized since *Didache* says “recite the Lord’s Prayer three times a day,” that the acclamation was included as a response to what Jesus taught, just as we have the other responses or acclamations in our liturgy today. As we know, liturgical greetings and responses have been around since they were first written down, some from the New Testament and Paul’s letters. The first record of an acclamation to the Lord’s Prayer comes from the *Didache*. From 1570 – 1970, the acclamation was not done during the Mass. Since the updating of the Mass after the Second Vatican Council, the acclamation returned – with a special embolism (“Deliver us LORD from every evil...”) between the prayer and the acclamation.

Thanks for all you do for SPB! Let us continue to pray for each other!
