5th Sunday of Ordinary Time – Beginning of the Catholic Charities Appeal: Last weekend our scriptures reminded us, through Saint Paul's letter to the Corinthians, the importance of loving and living our discipleship with this being our guide. Compassion and mercy are elements of our faith that Pope Francis is highlighting in this Year of Mercy. What a wonderful way to begin our annual appeal for Catholic Charities, with this preparation, prayer and reminders as we prepare to mail in our pledge/payment for the annual Catholic Charities Appeal.

This weekend at the Masses, I will have the opportunity to remind us of the 150 services, 40 locations and over 400,000 people we serve through our annual support of this important ministry. The theme this year sums up is why and what we do as Catholic Christians, here in the Diocese of Cleveland: **LOVE POWERS OUR MISSION**. We bring that love of God to so many as we manifest this love uniquely through signs and works, helping the poor, the marginalized, the sick, the suffering and share in God's mercy.

Each year, each parish has a goal amount given based on our previous years of generosity. Thank you for contributing – either by responding to the letter you received in the mail, or filling out a letter/card in the pew this weekend. For the homebound, please remind your Communion Minister to bring you a form if you didn't receive one in the mail already. Once you sign up through the mail, you will receive your regular reminders and reports for what Catholic Charities is doing to support our mission of Jesus Christ. As always, thanks for this important witness.

Preparing for LENT: Why is Ash Wednesday/Easter so early this year? This is the number one question of 2016, so far! Let's remember that Easter is always based on the Lunar Calendar each year, Sunday after the first full moon after the Vernal (Spring – in our hemisphere of the earth) Equinox. This year, Vernal Equinox (Spring) is 6:29 a.m. (EDT), Sunday, March 20, the full moon is Wednesday, March 23 – hence Easter Sunday is March 27. So we count back the weeks to celebrate and prepare for Easter by the season of Lent, beginning in the Roman Catholic Calendar with Ash Wednesday - THIS WEDNESDAY!!! (For Orthodox and Eastern Rites have a different calendar, and some begin Lent tomorrow, Monday, February 8). May I remind you of the many celebrations we have for LENT and opportunities to “get back to the basics” of our faith and life as Catholic Christians?

- Join us for Weekday Masses – 9:00 a.m., (including Saturday) Monday and Wednesday at 12:15 p.m. and Tuesday at 6:30 a.m. or the Shrine celebrates at 11:30 a.m. weekdays
- Join us for the Liturgy of Hours – 20 minutes of prayer either at 8:00 a.m. or 4:45 p.m. in the chapel
- Join us for the public recitation of the rosary – 20 minutes, 8:30 a.m. Monday – Saturday; we also recite one decade of the rosary with the school faculty, weekdays at 7:30 a.m.
- Make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament or join one of the regular hours of prayer in the chapel, Monday – Friday
- Participate in the Stations of the Cross, Fridays at 7:00 p.m.

- Join in the parish mission February 27 – March 2 (see the notice elsewhere)
- Celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation, Wednesday, February 24, Saturdays, or by coming to the parish office (call the office to make sure that the priest on duty is present, because sometimes we are away on an emergency call)
- Call a friend; visit the sick; volunteer in a ministry to share, live your discipleship and faith

These are but a few things to do for Lent; don't forget Operation Rice Bowl (ORB) and the importance of fasting and abstaining from meat, as a penance. Please, as you fast and abstain, pray for those around the world who are suffering, do not have adequate food or water, and support ORB that provides assistance as part of Catholic Relief Services (our international arm from Catholic Relief Services in Washington, DC) that sends our funds to areas of the globe most in need. I have seen the importance of our work in Namibia and South Africa, in the rural parts of our country. Thank you for sacrificing, sharing your change and providing assistance for those most in need.

OLD PALM BRANCHES: If you forgot to bring your palm branch back to church, have no fear! You may bring it back at any time. During the Easter Vigil fire (Saturday, March 26, 8:00 p.m.) we will burn them respectfully.

Meanwhile, enjoy this last day of Catholic Schools Week – and thanks for spreading the word about our award-winning school and excellent Parish School of Religion (PSR) program. I look forward to being with these families for the Noon Mass and our annual party to celebrate. Have a nice Mardi Gras on Tuesday, see you on Ash Wednesday!
