FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



2nd Sunday of Lent: Deep into the process of Lent, the church reminds us of Christ's Transfiguration each year on the 2nd Sunday of Lent. It helps us remember that our temptations, prayers, fasting and almsgiving lead us into a transformation – a transfiguration. We walk up the mountain with the LORD to hear the great message of being God's beloved, just as Christ did. Hold fast! Keep faith! The LORD is with us and will guide us!!

Special Blessing: At some of the Masses this weekend, we will bless our Prayer Shawl Ministry. Regularly, you see in the bulletin that this ministry invites you to share Prayer Shawls with those in need of love, care or support. We thank the women who gather and pray as they knit these beautiful shawls. Additionally, their

ministry has expanded to pocket shawls of prayer and for infants being baptized, to let everyone know of the community of prayer that is here at SPB. If there is someone who is depressed, lonely, sick or ill, in need of some support or love, please call the office and request the gift of a shawl. Pass the shawl on and let them feel the love of this community and let its prayers surround THEM!!

Suggestion Box: The yellow box that the Pastoral Council has put into the narthex has been a regular feature of the meetings each month. Many times the pieces of paper contain questions and not suggestions, but they are helpful for some to hear and review. Here were the ones placed in January:

- **Do you (any of the SSS living at SPB) ever accept diner invitations into parishioners' homes?**

Yes! You just have to call or email the person that you wish to invite over to your home.

- **Bells at the Consecration?**

During the weekday Masses at 9:00 a.m. we still celebrate this ancient custom. It is an option for the Order of Mass. However, after the Second Vatican Council most Eucharistic Theologians (and in our SSS community) stopped ringing the bells for one simple reason: It is not only at the words of the institution narrative (commonly called the consecration prayers) that the Eucharist becomes the Eucharist or is the most important part. Rather, the entire prayer is consecratory – and the entire prayer is important. We would or should ring bells for the entire prayer; and this is why we do not! All the words are sacred, holy and special.

- **Are there any priests, deacons or brothers who have more time than others for spiritual counseling/direction?**

Yes and no. Just make an appointment with one of the names listed in the bulletin at anytime. Fr. John, Deacon Joe and I are the most available to our parishioners.

- **Please explain why the church doesn't dip the host rather than sharing the common cup?**

The US Bishops want us to take the command of Christ seriously: Jesus didn't say "take and dip," he said, "take and drink."

- **Thank you for singing “Let There Be Peace on Earth” on December 31st at the 4:30 p.m. Mass. Why did I have to wait 2 years to hear it? Please sing it regularly.**

One of my favorite sayings is, “You cannot miss a week or a day at SPB.” At almost every civic holiday we sing this song. Sorry, you have missed it! We also sing it whenever there is a Peace Votive Mass during weekdays.

Thanks for your constant questions – and suggestions. Keep them coming! Since the suggestion box was opened, I was asked last weekend a few times, “When are we getting the Liturgy Survey results?” They are coming soon! Since there were more than 1,000 surveys returned, it is taking time to compile them. Results will be published in the bulletin as soon as possible.

“Keep on keeping on!” Enjoy this Lent and let us continue to pray for each other.

JESUIT TRADITION - Peter Faber spent two years in Portugal and Spain, helping to establish the Society of Jesus. In 1546 Pope Paul III appointed him to be one of the expert theologians at the Council of Trent. By that time, at age 40, Peter's health was precarious. He was exhausted by incessant efforts and constant journeys, always accomplished on foot. He left Spain to attend the Council in Rome, but weakened by fever, the future Saint Peter Faber died on August 1, reportedly in the arms of Ignatius Loyola. In a diary of his spiritual life, Faber entered a final note beginning with a quotation from Psalm 103: "Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget none of His benefits."
