New this year, we will be holding a Texas Hold'em Tournament on Sunday, May 22nd from 2-5PM. Registration fee is \$50 with all registration monies paid out as prize money. 5th Sunday of Easter Time: Our readings this Sunday remind us of the mystery of why from bad things, good things may occur. That love led, as we hear from the Acts of the Apostles, to great works being accomplished on behalf of the church.

Here at SPB, as we wind down another school year, we recognize all the good we accomplished for the betterment of “building God’s kingdom.” We are gearing up for an incredible parish festival – now 4 days – with a special Family Knight on Thursday. You will enjoy our school band and their performance. I appreciate all who are turning the raffle tickets in early, for the early bird prizes, those who are beginning to sign up and volunteer, and the many families and businesses that are sponsoring this event. We continue to pray for good weather!

Other Consultation & Brainstorming: You may have noticed after these 7 years together in our pastorate how I do broad consultation and brainstorming with parishioners, but especially rely on the Pastoral Council and Finance Council for input and consensus decisions. I appreciate those ideas that I have floated and the feedback you have given to them already. We are continuing to highlight our maintenance needs and capital improvements. After this time of doing a “feasibility study,” we will eventually prioritize. Continue to share with me your ideas and thoughts and see the Easter bulletin again for the list of ideas that have already surfaced for improving our campus and building our faith community. No decisions will be made until the late fall— and as always, with me, you know I will publicize them in this column!

One other idea! Is it time for another picture directory? It’s been five years since we had our photos taken for a parish directory, highlighting the beautiful people of SPB and our ministries. If you would like to be part of a committee to help put this together, please let me know. I already have one great volunteer from the Pastoral Council who is interested in supporting this project.

Taste of the Town: It’s time to finalize our 5th annual Taste of the Town Committee. As I have mentioned before, this event is a fundraiser for the school – and the committee decides how these funds are utilized to enhance the arts

program for the school. Last year, we raised \$18K for the school, with two grants of \$1,000 going toward art and music. We were able to purchase guitars for the 6th graders music class. The rest of the funds support the operating budget of the school this year.

Let's gather to plan for our **Saturday, November 5** event and put together another great committee: Our meeting will be **Tuesday, May 31 at 8 a.m.** in the Father Arkins Conference Room. Pray about it – and join in this great planning for another great event at SPB!

STEWARDSHIP REPORT

From the Finance Council:

Thanks for continuing to support our parish and its vital ministries. Some of our recent expenses – highlighting as we said we would from our pastoral plan – what your tithing supports:

- Our current parish debt/yet to go on our roof loan: \$269,733.36
- You donated \$109,392.61 year to date toward the roof and maintenance fund
- Rental income to the Eymard Room: \$1,695
- Athletic Association Rental of Father Jette Gym: \$9,100 (toward the 13 K each year that the Athletic Association supports for the maintenance of the building)
- \$31,163 Rooted in Faith Income - those paying off their pledge commitment to the diocese whereby we receive 30% back to the parish – this goes toward repayment of our roof loan and parish maintenance. Since we quickly paid of the loan on the church HVAC a few years back, we have been fortunate to equally continuing making payments on the roof!

Later, our volunteers went out with the food and clothing to help people in need near Bethel Church. We have also been helping some residents at Villa Serena who are so appreciative. All in all it was a very busy week but it is such a reward to see the smiles and hear their thank you's. What a ministry of loved to the unloved. God bless you and thank you so very much. Registration: Registration is now underway for the 2016-2017 PSR school year. Forms were sent home with current students in early April.
