10th Sunday in Ordinary Time: We now return to Sundays in “Ordinary Time.” It’s good for us to recall that the name “Ordinary Time” comes to us from the Latin, “ordo” for “counted.” It does not mean “banal,” or the same or something else as if there is the “extraordinary time” and then just “normal” or ordinary. Each Sunday, each day, we have the unfolding of the mystery of God in our life. As I preached about two weeks ago, God continues to manifest and we continue to experience that love and then share that love! We are unfolding in our loving – God being patient with us, and we with

one another.

Today’s Gospel reminds us of the great miracle that Jesus performed. What constitutes a miracle for you? How often do you see miracles and the power of God working in our midst? Let us be aware of each blessed, great day – each day where God performs countless miracles and allows us to share in this glory!

Spring Fling: The joys of this parish festival continue to be felt. Talk about “bigger, better” and the generosity of so many. We have publicized the list of our sponsors for their generosity supported our festival in ways you can’t believe. So many volunteers dedicated so many hours. Once all our bills are paid, we will have a full report here in the bulletin.

Our Next Big Event- Taste of the Town: As so many said to me during the 4-day festival, “SPB knows how to put on a good party! New Order of Matrimony: A few weeks back, I went to a workshop on the new marriage rite. It’s more updated than new, and we have already enjoyed some items since the update of our prayer texts for the Mass. Having the updated ritual helps serve as an opportunity for sharing about this rich theology and joy of the sacrament. I have had a few conversations with families lately, suffering the loss of not having a “church ceremony.” Many couples today feel that the church is a “wall” or “non-welcoming” place and do not want to have to work with rules or regulations.

Often these rules and regulations are dictated by the insurance industry in an attempt to avoid accidents and injuries. We hope that couples will still give the church a chance – to pray and work with us. Please lovingly share this news and the sacred opportunities and celebrations. As I have mentioned to many families, we have to try not to be judgmental or condemning, this even includes if parents do not baptize their child. Love and welcoming goes a long way; invite for another look, another chance, help them be open – but, above all, don't nag! The more you "tell" someone to do something, as you know, the more they will avoid. Let's help them discover the riches of our church's heritage as the Holy Spirit moves in their lives. Like Pope Francis' new spirit of openness and acceptance, helping the church to be a place of hospitality and love, let us witness this gift!

Let us continue to pray for each other – especially those who are separated from the church's life! Thanks for your gentle, kind, witness of faith! And for helping build God's kingdom here at SPB!

PSR AND OTHER NEWS FROM THE PEKO'S

PSR REGISTRATION:

Registration is now underway for the 2016-2017 PSR school year. Forms were sent home with current students in early April. Additional forms will be available from the Parish Office and on psr.saintpaschal.com. To avoid a late fee, please register as soon as possible. Early tuition rates for this year are \$85 for 1 child, \$155 for 2 children, and \$230 for 3 or more children. **Scholarships are available.** Additionally, our registration form serves as the emergency medical form as well as the media release form for your convenience. **Special note:** Two years of sacramental preparation is required. If you have a child entering 1st grade or 7th grade and are interested in them receiving their sacraments in 2nd and 8th grades the following year, please make sure to enroll them in PSR for this coming school year.
