11th Sunday in Ordinary

Time: Since we are in the Gospel of Luke this year, we hear a lot of experiences where Jesus is dining at someone's house when something else occurs. These combined theological and logistic places are not

accidents for the Gospel writer. He carefully places the events and places in the context of a meal to remind us that each Eucharist calls us to reflect on our particular ministry that is to stem from this meal – this Eucharist. Reconciliation and Eucharist are key moments of renewal and rebirth. Just as our God invites us to the table of forgiveness, we are in turn called to go and do the same. Who do I have to forgive this week? Whom must I pray forgives me?

Prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament: It is summer prayer recruitment time! Elsewhere in the bulletin you will see times that need a person to commit to an hour of prayer. One of the aspects of your prayer time is to pray for forgiveness. Thank you for sacrificing an hour to come here and pray.

Being Green: Summertime is a good “reminder time” too. While the above paragraph reminds us of the need for praying, may I remind you that SPB tries its best to be a “green parish,” meaning, we do not wish to add any more chemicals to the planet that will not recycle or decompose. For the most part, we have removed all Styrofoam from our campus and use paper products. For those groups that plan events, remember the “Go **Green** Knight” initiative @SPB – and use products that are helpful for the environment. We know that during Spring Fling we have tried to recycle – only to have people not separate their garbage. Perhaps next year we may have some folks assist us in the separation or monitoring of the trash, so that recyclables could be together?

Tithing for Manna Ministry: When we had to stop BINGO due to the opening of the casinos around town, we had two years where we asked all parish fundraising events to tithe 10% to SPB's operating budget to make up for the financial loss of BINGO. With our fundraising efforts, cost cutting measures and “grateful giving,” we have been able to balance our expenses. With that change in budgeting, at our Leadership Day two years ago, our parish leaders voted to help follow the mandate of Pope Francis, by being encouraged to tithe 10% to the poor or those in need. Initially we were to tithe 5% to Manna Ministry and 5% to Helping Hands Ministries. However, Helping Hands leadership board felt that the parish was generous enough to just offer all the tithing completely to Manna Ministry. A reminder, Manna Ministry helps our own parishioners who struggle from time to time and are in financial need. For the last year, all fundraising or “tithing” has gone to the Manna Ministry.

At our last Finance Council meeting, we revisited this policy and we made a commitment to budget 10% of our parish's income, or tithing to Manna Ministry, rather than just fundraising tithing. Our next Finance Council meeting will have a special discussion on how we will do this and educate our parishioners on tithing. Interesting, two weeks ago, in our first reading, we heard of how 10% was giving right off the top on the blessings to the LORD. That's tithing! If you have not practiced this blessing model, whereby you share with God what is already God's, I encourage you to try it and see how your life will be changed.

Lectors needed: We have had a few dedicated teen lectors over the years, with another one *going off to college*. We encourage other youth to lector. Also, anyone who has made their first communion is eligible in this parish – and of course has the gift of proclaiming well! Please contact johnschuster9@yahoo.com to volunteer as a lector and be trained

Our Next Big Event- Taste of the Town: We have a dedicated Core Committee of 4 people for our next Taste of the Town and already 4 restaurants committed. Perhaps your restaurant, or another you know, would enjoy participating on **Saturday, November 5?** Taste of the Town is a parish fundraiser that benefits the school, with \$1,000 raised for music, \$1,000 raised for the art program, 10% tithing to Manna Ministry, benefiting those in need, and the rest going to assist the school's operating budget. We have a school art project coordinator – with other duties to be aligned. Let us know if you would like to be part of the core team. We will also have our school raffle. SAVE the DATE!

Let us continue to pray for each other – especially those who are separated from the church's life!
