## FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

### Frequently Asked Questions:

Many times people feel uncomfortable asking a priest questions, even saying sometimes, “This is probably a dumb question.” I never hesitate to remind people that there is no such thing as a dumb question. When we are curious, we should ask, learn

and find out. Over my 24 years of being a priest, there have been regular questions. Here’s a few, but also a guide to what you may ask at our Listening Session on Tuesday, September 13 or the night we start the “inquiry” for becoming Catholic, Thursday, September 15:

- **Are you able to change your godparents?** Sadly, no. It does come up, especially at the time of confirmation while trying to find a sponsor, where candidates and parents want to “start over.” We are not allowed in Canon Law – one of those permanent things.
- **What is “tithing” and how is it pronounced?** “Tithing” is a very important way of living our stewardship with God. It is pronounced with a long “I” – like “tie” with a hard “th.” As Christians, we learn about tithing from sacred scripture and a basic principle of following God. It is first introduced in Malachi 3: 8 – 10 in the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament). It is a way of showing thanks to God for many blessings – so that one gives first to God before anyone or anything else. When someone is generous with us, don’t we want to show appreciation? This is true with all things from God. The percentage amount of 10% is encouraged from the Bible. As a parish, we tithe – and this year as a way to show our gratitude of the many blessings, we are tithing to our Manna Ministry, an outreach program to those in need in our parish. When our parish is generous with giving to the poor and sharing our blessings, we are blessed even more! It is true in my personal life. While I do not pay personal income tax because I am a “religious,” consecrated with a vow of poverty, I still tithe by giving 10% of my allowance or treasure, 10% of my time and 10% of my talent back to God throughout the year. This is one reason why I still offer to play the piano and organ and sing and do some volunteer work in Northeast Ohio. We are all encouraged to annually review how God has blessed us and how we give to God from the beginning of our blessings, not at the end of it all. All belongs to God anyway – tithing demonstrates that we get this and want to give thanks to God first by this practice of spiritual sacrifice and giving.
- **Do priests go to confession?** All the time! Many of us have a regular spiritual director or confessor we go and celebrate this sacrament together and having someone help us in our own spiritual journey.

- **If you eat meat on a Friday in Lent will you go to hell?** No. Hell is a permanent place for people have chosen to go away from God. Eating or not eating meat on Friday is a spiritual practice that reminds us again of the spiritual benefits of our life, to be mindful of the food and other blessings God gives us and the sacrifices we make at times to improve our lives, praying for those who are in need.
- **Why do I have to go to a priest to tell my sins and receive forgiveness? Can't I just talk to God?** Yes – but we also celebrate a sacrament of penance/reconciliation or forgiveness to ask pardon for our sins against one another too. The priest stands as a witness to God's mercy, so that we hear and experience the gift of mercy and reconciliation and a person who lets us know we truly are forgiven.
- **Why do I have to go to Mass each Sunday?** I usually answer this question with, “Why do I eat each day?” These are important parts of healthy living, just as hearing it is part of our healthy spiritual living to hear Sacred Scripture, be part of rituals and have God nourish us. When we miss a vital part of our life, we are not growing as we should. And even more important, God created us to praise and worship – together, as a People of God, the Body of Christ. The commandment came from God – it was not a “suggestion.” We are so connected and God has always had a “group” covenant to hold us together and help us see the image of God with one another and not just with a mirror by ourselves.

These our regular questions and some of my “simple” answers to assist people in their quest for knowing a little more about their faith, Catholic practices, rules and laws. Our Pastoral Plan asks us to learn more about our faith and for me to share questions and answers with you. **Do not ever hesitate to ask a question** – come and ask at the events coming in September, or you may always contact one of the priests via email or in person. The best time to ask questions is after a Mass or when we have some time to answer you. On the way up the aisle as Mass starts is a little challenging – but has been done over the years! ☺ Thanks for always being inquisitive about your faith and know that this dialog helps all of us become closer to God, closer to the One of all knowledge and love for us!

See you Sunday at Mass – and let's continue to pray for each other!
