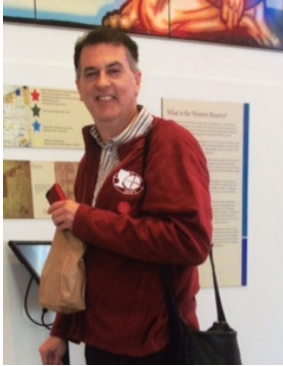

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time: Luke's Gospel only has the story of Zacchaeus. Zacchaeus was seeking out Jesus – and Jesus was seeking him out too. It's a story of many facets helping us to give our own examination of conscious. It is wonderful to know that our God always wishes to “stay” with us, no matter where we are in our lives. That thought alone should help us to do a better job of examining our lives and turning them over to the LORD, who knows us really well anyway.

News of the Week: The other day our longest continuously serving staff member, Stefi Somrack, our receptionist and parish secretary celebrated 34 years of service to our parish. The next day, she announced her retirement to spend more time with her family. Her last day is December 31. We are so grateful to her for dedication, care and service to our parish. It will be very difficult to replace her wealth of knowledge about the parish and many of you. During the month of November we hope to train a new person to fill the position. If you are interested, please contact our Business Manager, Michelle Mazza, for a job description and application.

Our Lady Star of the Sea Rosary Group: You may have seen in the *Sun Messenger* and *Cleveland.com* that our Rosary Group had a special article about their 20th anniversary year of service. What a nice picture, too! Ask for their autograph and they will gladly share another rosary that they have made too. Congratulations, “ladies of the rosary,” and thank you for your dedication and service to spreading the great message of prayer and communion with the saints and one another.

Remembering the Dead: This is a special week of prayer and Masses. Tuesday is All Saints Day and Wednesday the commemoration of the faithful departed (formerly called All Souls Day). Please join us for one of the Masses on Tuesday (6:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m., 12:15 p.m., 7:00 p.m.) On Wednesday morning, during the 9:00 a.m. Mass, we will read the list of those who have died in the past year from the banners in the sanctuary. At the baptismal font, we will also have the *Book of the Dead*, so that you may remember other members of your family and friends who have died that you wish to remember with us during the month of the dead.

Final Surveys: All summer we have been mentioning the feasibility study and the chance for you to share your input and be interviewed. We are now making one more aspect – an online survey that every parishioner is welcome to participate. It's on our website: saintpaschal.com. Much input is necessary – and thankfully we are starting to develop a consensus around certain projects of value to begin a capital campaign. Please continue to pray for the Pastoral Staff, Pastoral Council and Finance Council who will give me the final determination to bring to Bishop Lennon to move forward for the future of the parish.

Suggestion Box: A highlight of each Pastoral Council meeting is the opening of the suggestion box. One comment from the suggestion box asked the priests to speak from the pulpit about the election and tell people how to vote. Unfortunately, because we are a non-profit, 501c3, we are not able to do this sort of preaching, nor are we allowed to have on display anywhere on our property political statements. The comment made said, “Catholic Radio does it, why can't my own church?” This is the reason – we are non-profit – or not for profit – different laws and regulations govern radio stations.

Furthermore, if you see people placing items on your windshield, please call the police, for they are trespassing on **private** property. The church may never look like it

is endorsing are allowing political propaganda. Thanks for helping us maintain our non-profit status and not being fined.

Other Suggestions: A suggestion was made to post CYO games and scores. We will look into adding this feature to the website. Another statement was made about “no baptisms on Saturdays, go back to Sundays.” We baptize babies any day of the week except during the Triduum. If the comment was directed during a regular Saturday, Mass, then you must remember that Saturday Masses “count” for Sunday, and families request these baptisms during **their** regular family Mass. As you have noticed, they do not add any more length to the Mass – we still give our hour of praise to God.

Fixing the Southeast Narthex: Our best guess for the replacing of this narthex, hit by a car before a weekday 12:15 p.m. Mass, is 6 weeks. Thanks for your patience as you enter through the east/choir door. This is being “fixed” by the insurance companies that are involved with the diocesan building department.
