WHAT ARE YOU DOING for LENT?



A number of parishioners have requested an opportunity to come together to reflect on Scripture, to learn more about our faith, and to share with one another. In response, the Spiritual Formation Committee is again sponsoring the ARISE: Together in Christ Program, where you can do all

these things in a small group setting.

Our next program will begin the week of February 27, 2017 and will run for six weeks during Lent. Small groups will gather once a week for an hour and a half, on a day and time of their choosing. Each participant will receive a book which contains prayer, Scripture readings, reflections and faith-sharing questions. The atmosphere is informal and a trained leader will help to facilitate the prayer and sharing. The cost of the 6-week program is \$13, which covers the cost of the book.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Due to the holiday publication schedule, this bulletin was prepared January 1.

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time:

Last Monday, the church celebrated the feast of the Baptism of the LORD. Twice, depending on the day Christmas falls, this feast is on a Monday, and Christmas

Time is shortened for us. So it's wonderfully timely that we have a reading from John's Gospel recalling Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist. The Baptist testifies to the Son of God and to God's Spirit being in the world. Two important elements for us to keep in mind as we, like the Baptist, are also to point out where Christ and the Holy Spirit are in our current world.

This is a chance for us to reflect on our own lives – are we a pessimist or an optimist? Seeing the glass half empty or half full? Seeing God's grace everywhere or are we doomed, steeped in sin? The Psalm helps us too, for it echoes what we know to be true of our baptismal covenant with God: Here am I, LORD; I come to do your will!

Octave for Christian Unity: For more than 100 years, January 18 – 25 has been an opportunity for all Christians to come together to pray for Christian Unity. This is a special year, since it is the 500th Anniversary of the beginning of the Reformation. You may have seen the commemorative prayer opportunity that Pope Francis accomplished when he went to Sweden to pray with the Lutheran Communion and begin the year-long remembrances, acknowledging the sin of separation, and the work of rebuilding the church together. Pope Francis has also been carefully, eagerly and symbolically working at unification with the Orthodox. He had the first meeting since 1054 in Cuba with the Russian Orthodox "pope" or patriarch. These are historic times for all of our churches, Catholic, Orthodox and Protestant.

Each month I participate in an interfaith gathering of clergy in the Hillcrest area. What a joy to share a meal together, pray, share our Sacred Scriptures, receive homily tips and work on issues in our neighborhood. We have had the long custom of meeting at Thanksgiving to pray together. We are furthering this commitment by having a special gathering for the first time for the USA National Day of Prayer. This day is always the first Thursday of May. We will host an interfaith "vigil service" here, **Wednesday, May 3, at 7:00 p.m. I ask you to place this day on your calendar now – as we celebrate and pray for unity in our country** and seek the common good. This is one thing we are able to do together in our nation; what a blessing to have no government interference in our worship! During this Week of Christian Unity, let us recognize concrete ways we are able to grow the Body of Christ together and plan for these events to be a success by our presence and participation.

Hearing Assist System: Through a generous grant, we were able to purchase a hearing assist system for the church. Like a lending library, the devices are kept with the musicians and you may come to the piano before Mass to receive the device and then return it to the piano at the end of Mass. Special thanks to Sam Massina, class of 1966, for always making sure through his Showtime Sound Company, that we have the best in sound for our difficult space and the most updated equipment.

Continued New Year Blessings, good health, comfort and joy! I ask your prayers for me while I present some workshops at a national liturgy convention in El Paso, Texas this week and then take my usual winter vacation break the following week in Palm Springs, California. Let us continue to pray for each other!
