## CLOWN/HELPING HANDS MINISTRY

Our ministry is so happy to let you know of one homeless who is now off the streets and being a tremendous help to our ministry. He wrote an article for the Cleveland Street Chronicle newspaper, entitled "You Have To Give In Order To Get". It is a long article and I wanted to bring out some of the important events of this great man and highlight what this ministry has meant to him. His name is Mike Vorhess and here is some of what he wrote.

*I was homeless for 15 years and have struggled with alcohol and drugs for more than 20 years. When I say homeless I mean living under bridges on the streets along the riverbanks. I had no faith or coping skills and reality did not seem real. Life is different for me today and it all began to change one night in the winter of 2002. There I met Bob Ukovic and Deacon Joe from St. Paschal Baylon while they were volunteering. For the past five years I have been off the streets and living in an apartment overlooking Lake Erie. This was made possible by the Helping Hands Ministry working with other resources as well as items donated by St. Paschal parishioners. As I brought my life back together staying sober and listening to what God wants me to do I realized I can help others who have been in my situation. During the past two years the Knight Riders Group has allowed me to join them as a volunteer. I have been humbled and honored to be a part of this ministry. I will be forever grateful for the love and trust Bob Ukovic and Deacon Joe have given me. They also showed me a parish that is amazingly supportive and truly believe in the work they do. We are all God's beautiful people, thank you Clown and Helping Hands Ministry and St. Paschal Baylon parish and the Blessed Sacrament religious for being the hands and feet of God.*

**5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent:** Many of us have lost a friend who was close to us. We can comprehend the tremendous loss that Jesus and Mary and Martha were experiencing. It is the shortest line in the scriptures: And Jesus wept. If you have had a chance to see the movie that was based on the bestselling book, *The Shack*, there are wonderful dialogues about why there is evil, death and sin in the world. God loves in spite of loss, death, grief and the evil around us. God allows this that He may be glorified and we learn to love as God loves.

This reading prepares us for the impending passion, death and resurrection of Christ. It reminds us of the passion and suffering that our life is about – but also the tremendous hope and love God has for each one of us. Through our baptism, we have been risen up in Christ so that we will never die but always have life!

**Championship Celebration:** Our senior girls CYO basketball team won as city champs and ended up going to state to take 3<sup>rd</sup> or bronze! Congratulations Girls! And many thanks to your parents and coaches, especially Tony Isabella, for their hard work and dedication. During the Saturday 4:30 p.m. Mass, we will honor them and present the trophies.

**Low-Gluten Host Stations:** More and more people are discovering that they have an intolerance for gluten. If you or a visitor is such, please come to the sacristy to let us know that you would like to take a low-gluten host. Please let us know where you will be sitting so that you may come to that station. The communion minister will say, "The Body of Christ" and have you open the pyx containing this special kind of host that is segregated from the gluten hosts. FYI: There must be even the smallest amount of gluten possible to be in a host for it to be "valid matter," part of the theology of the Eucharist. There is no such thing as a "gluten free" host for this reason. Those who have a complete intolerance for gluten usually receive from the chalice the Precious Blood, which is why we always offer a chalice at every Mass, to fulfill the command of Christ and also have the sacrament available for reception.

**Holy Week is Coming!** Please plan on attending our special liturgies – the highlight of the year. If you have never experienced them, you must! Filled with much symbolism and meaning, there is much participation from your part! Next week we process with our blessed palms, remembering that we "walk by faith" as Jesus did, to our ultimate destiny: the new and eternal Jerusalem! We enjoy special Morning Prayers at 9:00 a.m. Thursday, Friday and Saturday in the chapel.

Holy Thursday we enjoy our wonderful potluck – an Agape or love meal, washing feet, the Liturgy of the LORD'S Supper and a procession with the Blessed Sacrament to the Saint Ann Shrine (north bound on cross alley). We carry candles and sing in adoration and praise as we get ready for Good Friday. On Good Friday we bring back our sacrificial gift and alms from Operation Rice Bowl, enjoy the Youth Group living stations, venerate the holy cross and remember the passion and death of our LORD.

Holy Saturday and the Easter Vigil are the high point of the entire liturgical year. During the morning, we prepare the church for the solemn night. Bring your traditional and "not so traditional" Easter foods to be blessed at Noon. Then, due to the sun setting so late this year, the Vigil begins at 9:00 p.m. in darkness. It is required by church law to do so for this is a solemn remembrance of the night Jesus Christ rose from the dead. We bless the new fire and Paschal Candle, we process in the "light of Christ," hear the stories of our salvation from the Scriptures, celebrate a baptism, confirmations, and renew our own baptismal covenant. Then we will have 3 First Communions. The Easter Vigil is still shorter than most professional sports games – and well worth the time commitment as we renew our life and faith in Christ. Please join us in the joy of the Sacred Easter Triduum!
