FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Due to the holidays and publication schedule, this column was written April 9.

Easter Sunday Joy – Week 2! We continue the Easter Season and finished out the Easter Octave – 8 days in a row of celebrating Easter Sunday – by having the “2nd week story.” We hear that Thomas was away and returns with deep faith and a statement that we have continued to say for centuries, “My LORD and my God.” Many of us say this during the Eucharistic Prayer while the Institution Narrative is said: This is my Body. This is my Blood – do this in memory of me. And so we have! We continue to live the Easter mystery each day of our lives, recognizing Christ in the breaking of the

bread, sharing the cup of joy, through our living Christ’s peace, through our forgiving and caring for one another and in other ways of sharing the mission of Christ. We have “done this” in memory of HIM for these years, because we wish to proclaim Christ’s death and his Risen life until Christ comes again. Until that return, may we continue to show our LORD and God to others through the actions of peace, forgiveness and love.

Your Prayers with Our Youth Group: Today our Youth Group Life in the Eucharist Team, 18 youth and 6 adults (including me) are flying back from our mission trip to the Navajo Nation. Our trip started with a donation from the Pelotte Foundation to Saint Michael Indian School. Being the administrator of the foundation, to make sure that it executed correctly, I followed up to insure that the school received the donation from the foundation. There were several funny stories and miscommunications along the way, but last summer, we finally settled the last of the estate and I was able to meet in person Dot Teso, the President of the Saint Michael Indian School. (Another Eucharistic saint, Saint Katherine Drexel who studied very closely Saint Peter Julian Eymard Eucharistic charism founded this school.) Bishop Donald Pelotte and Father Dana Pelotte, being part Native American had a very special affinity to this school and wanted to make a lasting gift and commitment to the school. When meeting with Dot last summer, while I was on vacation in New Mexico, we came up with the dream to have our youth LITE Team lead a retreat with the students from the Navajo Nation. Thanks to you, our generous parishioners, that dream became a reality! Dot visited here in October to introduce herself to us. As a parish, we raised \$12,000 and our own youth contributed \$200 each to pay for the trip. Our parish donated 500 hymnals to the school chapel, Mass cards to help them participate in the Mass and share the joy of the Risen LORD. Along the journey, we will have stopped at some other pueblos, that is, Native American cities, and also toured the historic sites of these lands, making a stop at Sanctuario Chimayo (an ancient shrine of holy dirt), the Cathedral Basilica of Santa Fe (dating to 1610), the Saint Joseph stair case, San Miguel Mission (from 1570s) and more. We bring your prayers and concerns along the journey – we are thankful to you for praying for us and being part of this great mission outreach.

Our pastoral plan has continued outreach to the world as an important goal. Last year, we raised money to build a house in Nicaragua, this year we led a retreat in the Navajo Nation. Thank you for helping us fulfill our Pastoral Plan – but more importantly, thank you for reaching out to the world and touching lives by living your faith and sharing your gifts with others! Where do we go next year?

Altar Server Training: Our last group of altar serving training for the 2016-2017 school year begins this week with our students who will be making their First Communion in two weeks. We wish to have them trained to help us through the summer months. They have to be strong enough to carry a candle or the “junior” Jesus cross, and have a great memory for memorizing the routines of the Mass. We are fortunate to have a YouTube training video series, thanks to Brendan Trepal. Even adults and young adults may serve and be part of the Mass: <https://youtu.be/QdghXxAwpYE>. There are two videos – one of them names of the objects and materials we use for Mass and the other is the actual walk through of the Mass. Just search for them on the internet. Join with me in church, Wednesdays at 2:35 p.m. for the next few weeks. Servers will be installed at the 10:00 a.m. Mass on Sunday, May 28.
