PASTORAL COUNCIL CORNER

On Monday, May 22, the final Pastoral Council session for the (fiscal) year began with a prayer: Grace before our Picnic/BBQ meal. Fr. Lane was our gracious host and provided the burnt offerings, while other members brought sides and desserts. The business part of the meeting came after the repast: the just concluded **Spring Fling Parish Festival** was a great success, according to preliminary reports. Council members staffed the Pasta Dinner, held this year in the Eymard Room, and attendance was steady throughout the evening; profit should be in the \$2,000 range. Parking for the event (and for the weekend Masses) is a perennial problem. Though a shuttle from local parking areas has often been proposed, the insurance/liability issue for vehicle/driver/parish is a big road block. The Spring Fling booklet with a listing of sponsors and advertisers cleared more than \$16,000, even before the event began! Sincere and very grateful thanks to all who gave support. The May 2 **Quarterly** meeting of ministry heads had good representation and discussion. Those attending supported the decision to replace Paschal Lane now with concrete pavement, adding a new safe pedestrian walkway and repairing and repaving the entire parking lot by sections, maintaining weekend use.

We are at the midpoint of the five year **Strategic Pastoral Plan** for SPB! After receiving input on progress from most stakeholders, Jeff Gueulette provided a detailed overview of accomplishments so far and a precise summary with recommendations pointing toward our goals. The **Suggestion Box** yielded one communication about the music volume. As this correspondent completes a three year PC term and lays down the pen, we are heartened that Jennifer Bartlett has volunteered to pick up the implement and continue monthly minutes and this PCC column. **New Pastoral Council members** needed: attend a meeting and discern how you may contribute!

We worry about being a “holy roller” or “televangelist”

personality that will turn people off. God just wants us to be us! Be yourself – and share the gifts of the Holy Spirit – talk about what you do to live your life in faith, in God. It’s natural to share a conversation about so many things; share about your experience of church worship, ministry as a faithful steward of our God.

REGISTRATION: Registration is now underway for the 2017-2018 PSR school year. Forms were sent home with current students in early April. For an early tuition rate, register before August 1st. Early tuition rates for this year are \$85 for 1 child, \$155 for 2 children, and \$230 for 3 or more children. **Scholarships are available.** Additionally, our registration form also serves as the emergency medical form as well as the media release form for your convenience. **Special note:** Two years of sacramental preparation is required. If you have a child entering 1st grade or 7th grade and are interested in them receiving their sacraments in 2nd and 8th grades the following year, please make sure to enroll them in PSR for this coming school year.
