Hello Parishioners of SPB! I'm sure many of you know me as Eva or Mrs. Mickol, third grade teacher, or Gigi's mom, the Bible Camp lady, or the crazy Youth Minister who plans all these trips and fun events for our parish. When asked to be a guest writer for the column, my first thought was what was I going to say that I don't already say in my weekly section under Youth Ministry. St. Paschal's has been my home for over 40 years now (I know I don't look that old, but I am!) I spend more time here than any other place on the planet and it truly is my second home. I just completed my 18th year as a teacher, and since 2014, have been the Youth Minister... this time around. I am so excited to start this fall as a Preschool teacher, and full time Youth Minister. I am ready to start this new chapter in my life, especially focusing on the pastoral plan family life goals. So much of who I am is because of this parish and the people I have met and served over the years. I truly love this place.

Three years ago I was diagnosed with thyroid cancer. I had to go in isolation during my radiation treatment, and I spent a lot of time in prayer. There was a song out during that time called "Oceans" by Hillsong United. It was my mantra during that scary time. My favorite part of the song is, *"Your grace abounds in deepest waters, Your sovereign hand will be my guide. Where feet may fail and fear surrounds me, You've never failed and You won't start now. So I will call upon Your name, and keep my eyes above the waves. When oceans rise. My soul will rest in Your embrace. For I am Yours and You are mine. Spirit lead me where my trust is without borders. Let me walk upon the waters. Wherever You would call me, take me deeper than my feet could ever wander, and my faith will be made stronger in the presence of my Savior."*

Week after week I search for the best Bible verse, song lyrics, or saint quote for my section of the bulletin, not ever knowing if anyone actually reads what I write. I am not a great writer, and I usually write my articles well past midnight most of the time, so I honestly hope they make sense! But I like to think the Holy Spirit leads me to certain Bible verses or quotes or song lyrics, that not only touches my heart, but reaches that one person who might need to hear those words. My jobs here at SPB are more than a "job". It's my vocation where I get to serve my family and friends, and those friends turn into my family. I have had the honor of teaching countless little third graders and Bible Campers who then join my youth group as teenagers and help them on their journey of faith. It's a vocation I do not take for granted and love with my whole heart. So if you are reading this, THANK YOU! Thank you for your love and support, your friendship and prayers. I look forward to serving you and our parish...wherever the Spirit leads us!

POPE FRANCIS REQUESTS: TAKE THE YOUTH SURVEY!

The Catholic bishops of the world are planning to meet in October 2018 for the 15th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops. The theme of this gathering is "Youth, Faith and Vocational Discernment." In preparation for this major synod on youth, Pope Francis wants to gather input from the Catholic faithful. Consequently, the Diocese of Cleveland has made available a survey questionnaire to gather information on the current state of the young in our diocese that will be included as part of the pre-synod discernment document. The Body & Blood of Christ: Recently at a gathering I heard the sad story of priests in India and how they are rationed with the altar wine. They only get 12 bottles for the entire year so that they are able to celebrate the Eucharist validly. This is not enough for the people in the congregation to even share once from the Blood of Christ. The priest represents them. Yet, they are content to have the little that they have and realize the significance of how God provides.

In our scriptures on this most famous solemnity, we realize that the Eucharist is such a precious gift to us. In our culture and country we have so much – God is always providing so many blessings, especially with food. Like the Israelites wondering in the desert to this very day, God nourishes us so that we may have life. Perhaps we take too much for granted. Perhaps we can learn to share our bread **and wine** with the needy. I sure wish I could have shared a bottle of wine with my brother SSS priests in India (but it would be taken away). Let us pray for the day when all may taste of the bread of life and the cup of blessing here on earth – so that they may know the foretaste of the heavenly banquet like we already do enjoy.

Saint Paschal Lane is Being Replaced: For the month of July, please use Blue Ribbon Way (that is the road by Father O’Brien Hall between the school and the convent) to park for Mass and other events. Thanks for praying for the success of the project and helping with the funding if you are able. Please remember that Blue Ribbon Way will always be a two-way drive during construction. STAY on the right to EXIT and hit the actuated signal to change.

Time and Duration Change for 2017-2018 PSR Year: To accommodate our new kindergarten PSR students, in the 2017-2018 school year, PSR will meet from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Please note the earlier start time as well as the new hour time length. PSR will still meet Monday evenings from September through May.

Registration: Registration is now underway for the 2017-2018 PSR school year. Forms were sent home with current students in early April. Additional forms will be available from the Parish Office and on <http://psr.saintpaschal.com> (click on "Registration Form" on the left sidebar.) For an early tuition rate, register before August 1st.
