POPE FRANCIS REQUESTS: TAKE THE YOUTH SURVEY!

The Catholic bishops of the world are planning to meet in October 2018 for the 15th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops. The theme of this gathering is "Youth, Faith and Vocational Discernment." In preparation for this major synod on youth, Pope Francis wants to gather input from the Catholic faithful. Consequently, the Diocese of Cleveland has made available a survey questionnaire to gather information on the current state of the young in our diocese that will be included as part of the pre-synod discernment document. The survey can be found on the diocesan website home page, www.dioceseofcleveland.org. All are invited and encouraged to participate by taking this short survey. The bishops of the United States pray that the results of this survey will help them more fully understand the experience of young people in our Church and in our country – their hopes, dreams, fears and struggles – so that the synod may bear fruit in offering more insight and direction to our ministry with young people.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Due to production schedules, this column and inserts for the bulletin were prepared June 8.

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time: After a few weeks of solemnities emphasizing the special mysteries of God, we now return to a continuous proclamation of the Gospel of Matthew, green vestments and liturgical ware for Ordinary Time and reflections that help us live the “reign of God” in our world today. It is helpful to remind ourselves that the Gospel, First Reading and Psalm all tie together. Our

second reading each Sunday is a bonus

of Scripture to hear from the New Testament letters and allow them to also be applied to our life today. The Gospel is the high point of the Liturgy of the Word for Mass, but from time to time, it is helpful for us to reflect on this Second Reading, these weeks on the letter to the Romans.

Saint Paul is trying to emphasize why Christ came into the world: to address salvation history and redeem us from our sins. And even more than this, Paul is reminding us that Christ brought to us the realization so that we may always know the “gracious gift” of God’s grace. This grace overflows into our lives because of Christ wanting to share that grace with us. How blessed we are to experience and know that grace and to be reminded of this greatest gift of grace in the Eucharist!

Saint Paschal Lane is Being Replaced: For the month of July, please use Blue Ribbon Way (that is the road by Father O’Brien Hall between the school and the convent) to park for Mass and other events. Our new cement Saint Paschal Lane driveway will take 4 weeks to replace and rebuild. This will also include a **new** sidewalk and additional handicap parking. Thanks for praying for the success of the project and helping with the funding if you are able. A letter will be sent home this week asking your financial assistance and one-time gift for this \$203,000 project. Please remember that Blue Ribbon Way will always be a two-way drive during construction. STAY on the right to EXIT and hit the actuated signal to change. (If you did not receive the letter, please let the parish office know. Those of you who are not parishioners, but regularly attend SPB, we appreciate your donations and generosity and always marvel at your stewardship and care of our place.)

“Fireside” Chat: There has been so much news this May & June and so much to put in the bulletin; I haven’t had the opportunity to report on our regular “fireside chat” that occurred on Monday, May 8. These “open door” moments, whether inside or outside are an opportunity for parishioners, with a Pastoral Council member to ask their questions, give their feedback or make suggestions about parish life. It was a little chilly on Monday, May 8 so we did have our gathering in the SSS lounge next to the fireplace. Here were some topics discussed with the two who attended:

- **Why don’t more people laugh at your jokes during the homily or announcements? Why don’t you tell more?** *My mom stopped paying people to laugh at my humor about 5 years ago – so now I’m on my own. Stories and jokes are appropriate at certain moments or with certain readings; not all occasions warrant humor. Only my bulletin column!*

- **What is in your glass that you are always drinking? And why – even lately it seems like you are drinking even more.** *Water is in the glass – the sacristans fill it up for me, sometimes with a dab of lemon! I know some have speculated on my favorite clear alcoholic beverage, but sadly, I do not like those as much as red wines and Maker’s Mark. I have to drink so much water due to the medication I take in the morning for my blood pressure and glaucoma.*
- **Have you enjoyed fulfilling the pastoral plan for the parish? What happens after it is over since we are in Year 3?** *Wonderful parishioners put together an incredible adventurous plan and it has been fun watching it come to life especially with so many goals fulfilled, from the Advancement Office to more currently expanding the Youth Minister position into full time with an emphasis on Family Life, a big chunk of the plan. After this plan, our parish will not stop – SPB people never settle! We want to keep growing and developing and we will have the Pastoral Council do a review and begin another cycle of assessment and setting priorities for the 2020s.*
- **Talk about the relics in the altar and have you ever thought of offering tours of the church and campus?** *When the church was dedicated in 1993 for the 40th anniversary of the parish, the relic of Saint Paul was received to be used for our altar. Since the church had not been dedicated when, as custom was until the new code of Canon Law in 1983, the church building had been paid off, it was one of those “slip through the crack items” that Fr. Wiese found out. When I became pastor, a friend of mine gave me a relic of Saint Paschal Baylon that he had, so I placed it in the altar. When Bishop Donald Pelotte, SSS died, he had a relic of Saint Peter Julian Eymard, so I placed this relic in the altar as well. And yes, I have thought about giving tours, and we will schedule one. (You may have noticed that since this Fireside Chat one is now scheduled for Sunday, August 27 at 1:15 p.m., following the Noon Mass. All are welcome – even non-Catholics! to learn about our church’s architecture and the history of the parish – and more!)*
- **Do you ever see the need for a full-time Catechetical Leader?** *Most definitely! We just need to tithe a bit more to fulfill this dream since our budget currently is not able to sustain this.*
- **What is the Saint Ann Triduum about and why 3 days?**
Saint Ann Triduum Schedule: Why Triduums? *The great 3 days or Triduum is the most important liturgical season and days – the Paschal Triduum when we remember the sacred moments in the 3 days in Christ’s life. We have had the practice and custom to do lots of things in three’s – especially in light of the mystery of the Trinity. Having three nights for two of our favorite saints is quite helpful for us to be on a “mini retreat” and contemplate the mystery of the saint and their life. Because of the patron saint of the American province of the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament (SSS), we have a special time to pray with the grandmother of Jesus – Good Saint Ann. She reminds us of the importance of our grandparents in our lives and what they teach us, especially in faith. I hope you’ll join with me in a month to participate in these three special Masses and rituals that are part of the events. And spread the word so that others may join with you for the following in church:*
- **Weekend Masses July 22/23** – preaching at the Masses and special blessing and gift of medals and prayers; sharing of the relic of Saint Ann for healing strength and other miracles that are needed in our life.
- **Monday, July 24, 7:00 p.m.** – {Memorial of Saint Sharbel – our dear Lebanese friend} This night is geared to families as we especially bless children, pray for those who wish to conceive, mourn with those who have lost a child and celebrate the gift of family life.

- **Tuesday, July 25, 7:00 p.m.** – {Feast of Saint James – our “Spanish” friend} We will celebrate the anointing of the sick and pray for one another and the healing powers of Christ’s in this sacrament.
- **Wednesday, July 26, 7:00 p.m.** – [Solemnity of Saint Ann] The culmination of the Triduum is this special celebration and the Mass of Saint Ann, a Eucharistic procession with the Blessed Sacrament.
- Each night, too, we have a chance for veneration of the relic for your personal needs and healings. I’ll share more about Saint Ann during the bulletins of July.

Those are the highlights and humor of “the chat” and the week. Enjoy the week ahead as we prepare to celebrate our nation’s anniversary. See you Sunday at Mass and let us continue to pray for each other!

At the Catholic Bishops of Ohio's June 2, 2017 Board of Directors meeting, the statement was approved. This statement is being sent to members of the Ohio General Assembly and Governor Kasich. You may look online for the statement.
2. The annual **Fortnight for Freedom begins June 21 and ends July 4**. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) is encouraging Catholics across the country to enter into the period two weeks prior to the Fourth of July with a strong focus on prayer, education and reflection on our first amendment to the Constitution, the freedom of religion.
