1,970 parish families

424 participated in the Catholic Charities appeal (22% of our parish); which is up from 15% last year.

424 pledged \$142,787 with \$94,997 received or paid to date, with 67% fulfillment of our parish goal of \$147,871 from the Catholic Community Foundation. We are currently at 96.56% of our goal! Help us reach and exceed our parish goal by participating today.

Info to share from our Pastoral Plan Project of Transparency & Reminders on our Parish Policies:

- We have begun a new fiscal year in the parish's life. Thanks for making July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017 so successful and financially sound for our **many** ministries and services that we provide.
- Our calendar has opened up for you to rent room space for your family events. Just a reminder, we do not ask for a stipend for Funeral luncheons, per parish policy when the Family Life Center was built in 2000.
- Mass Intentions are now available for the rest of 2017 & 2018. Some reminders:
 - Since Mass Intentions are gifts or offerings for the priest, there can be no financial ties or demands to them. Seven years back when as a parish we adhered to the General Instruction on the Roman Missal updates, which do not call for names to be mentioned during the Universal Prayer we stopped a custom that is common in several parishes.
 - Additionally, due to refund requests for mispronounced names and lectors receiving negative comments and pressure after Mass, we have decided to make it clear that there are no demands on this free-will/gift offering for Mass intentions.
 - Thank you for understanding and continuing to share the gift, both for the priest, but also for those you wish to honor.
 - Mass Intentions are for the living and deceased – for someone's birthday, anniversary or any occasion.
 - If you offer the Mass intention you may sit in the pew with the credence "gift table" in the middle of the nave to bring up the gifts of bread and wine. This way the priest may thank you personally for the offering and remembers your loved one with you at this time.
- Our parish is a tithing parish – meaning that as the Bible says, we give 10% of our funds to help Christ and those in need through our Manna Ministry. Manna Ministry supports our parishioners in a time of financial worry. THANK YOU for helping us witness this stewardship. We commit \$8,100 each month.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Again this week, I'm reflecting on our second reading for Mass from Paul's letter to the Romans. This reading is proclaimed at the Easter Vigil before the resurrection Gospel and the sacrament of initiation (baptism, confirmation & First Communion) and at many funerals. It is a favorite reading for many families who feel it summarizes their loved one's life in Christ and that death

has no power over them. We of faith remember that our baptism plunged us into the paschal mystery so that we would die with Christ only to live our lives alive in the Risen LORD. We will never die – we always will live. We are living and serving God and one another in Christ Jesus who, as the head of the Body of Christ calls us to live our baptismal covenant and promises each day of our lives. Sin and death have no power over us – so we can be assured and joyful that we are in Christ and Christ is in us!

Questions & Answers Feature Continues: Last week I hope you enjoyed the humor and news that came from the "Fireside Chat." Here are a few other questions that were asked and the answers that I shared at that session:

- **How did SPB get the patron saint of Paschal Baylon?** *When our parish was being created, the bishop of Cleveland asked the provincial superior at the time for a suggestion, especially for a Eucharistic saint. At the time our founder was not a saint, just a "blessed." The rule before the code of canon law that was updated in 1983 was that parish's could only be named with official saint names. Now you are able to name that after holy people who one day we hope to be saints. Meanwhile, back in 1953, when Fr. Donald Jette was a student and secretary to the provincial superior he suggested "Paschal Baylon:" First because he was an important saint of the Eucharist. Second because there were other Franciscan saints in neighboring parishes and this would tie the three Hillcrest area parish together and lastly because that was Fr. Jette's religious name: Bro. Paschal. Obviously the provincial and bishop approved!*
- **What are the differences between an apostle and a disciple?** *The title is given to those disciples who specifically went out to evangelize about Christ; they were the preachers of their time, then and now! So that's why we have Mary Magdalene or Peter Julian Eymard called apostles due to their preaching work and ministry*

From our Bishops...

1. We are asked to pray and review the **Ohio bishops' statement opposing the denial of Worker's Compensation benefits for undocumented workers**. At the Catholic Bishops of Ohio's Board of Directors meeting, the statement was approved. This statement is being sent to members of the Ohio General Assembly and Governor Kasich. You may look online for the statement.

2. The annual **Fortnight for Freedom begins June 21 and ends July 4**. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) is encouraging Catholics across the country to enter into the period two weeks prior to the Fourth of July with a strong focus on prayer, education and reflection on our first amendment to the Constitution, the freedom of religion. We pray for our country and those who serve it for the common good.

GUEST COLUMN- GEORGE AND ANNA PEKO

Each year, our Confirmation candidates are invited to speak with the presiding Bishop immediately before the Confirmation Mass. During this time, the Bishop touches base with the Confirmandi to talk with them about the wonderful sacrament they are going to receive. Last year, Abbot Gary Hoover, OSB presided over Confirmation at SPB. He challenged our students to reflect upon the 7 Gifts of the Holy Spirit. Now, we would like to share with you an abbreviated version of what our Confirmation class articulated. These thoughts, written by 8th graders, define the gifts and tell how the students see them and use them in their daily lives:

The 7 Gifts of the Holy Spirit were granted to us at our baptism. Now, as we become adults in the Church, these Gifts are strengthened through our Confirmation. According to the [Catechism of the Catholic Church](#), "the effect of the sacrament of Confirmation is the special outpouring of the Holy Spirit as once granted to the apostles on the day of Pentecost."

Each Gift can be used in our day-to-day lives. Our service hours, for example, demonstrated how the 7 Gifts of the Holy Spirit can be used to help God's will be done. God grants us these gifts for particular reasons. We can use these gifts to serve the Church.

As we learned, **Wisdom** is our ability to value spiritual things over worldly ones. It enables us to desire the things of God. We demonstrate wisdom when it comes to school and homework. We show wisdom when choosing to attend Mass. Wisdom is understanding what people are going through. Wisdom enables us to see life from God's point of view and to recognize the real value of people, events, and things. We pray for wisdom when discerning our vocation. We pray for wisdom in order to help others. We demonstrate wisdom when we pick and choose our battles. Wisdom helps us see Jesus in all people.

As we learned, **Knowledge** is awareness to God's plan. It is not simply an accumulation of facts but rather an understanding of God's purpose and how

we ought to respond. Knowledge helps bring to light temptations. We need knowledge in education because we are life-long learners and are on a life-long journey in our faith. Knowledge puts us in a better position to make a good decision. Knowledge helps us celebrate those different than ourselves. It also enables us to communicate in an effective and efficient manner to spread the Good News. Knowledge is also an understanding that you don't know everything.

As we learned, **Courage** sustains our decision to follow the will of God in any situation. It allows us to stand up and defend our faith, even when threatened by injury or death. Courage is tested in our daily lives. We need courage to stand up to bullies. It allows us to do the right thing even if we are being peer pressured not to. Courage allows us to participate in our faith. It takes courage to introduce Christ to others. It takes courage to have faith.

As we learned, **Right Judgment or Counsel** acknowledges the difference between right and wrong and bestows proper judgment. A person with right judgment avoids sin and leads a life for Christ. The Gift of Right Judgment helps us juggle what's right versus what's wanted. It is our moral compass. We know that if we use this Gift, there would be less sin and trouble in our lives. Without it, our lives would be a mess. Right judgement is good for our futures.

As we learned, **Understanding** helps us grasp the truths of the faith more easily and profoundly. The Gift of Understanding gives us insight into the truths of the faith. It helps us make right choices. When we or others we know are going through hard times, understanding allows us to know what God wants us to do. Understanding helps us encourage others to profess their faith and go to church. Service helps us understand.

As we learned, **Reverence** is our obedience to God and our willingness to serve Him. It is not just obedience through a sense of duty but rather obedience out of love and devotion. Reverence includes prayer, being nice to people, and thankfulness to God in our day-to-day lives because that is what God wants for us. God wants us to show respect and to have respect. When we show love for God's children and His world, we show love for God.

As we learned, **Wonder and Awe** makes us aware of the glory and majesty of God. Wonder and awe increases our desire to draw closer to God and depart from sin. Wonder and awe is awareness of God's Glory. We demonstrate this Gift when faced with temptation. Wonder and awe is like listening to our conscience. It is mindfulness. Wonder and awe is knowing the glory and majesty of God.

The 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit will be stirred up in us today as we receive Confirmation. We will carry these gifts with us and employ them to honor the Lord every day of our lives.

- **Weekend Masses July 22/23** – preaching at the Masses and special blessing and gift of medals and prayers; sharing of the relic of Saint Ann for healing strength and other miracles that are needed in our life.
- **Monday, July 24, 7:00 p.m.** – {Memorial of Saint Sharbel – our dear Lebanese friend} This night is geared to families as we especially bless children, pray for those who wish to conceive, mourn with those who have lost a child and celebrate the gift of family life.
