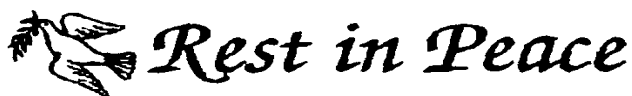

15h Sunday: While the Gospel parable reminds us of the parable of the sower, our second reading helps us recall that none of our sufferings are for naught. Instead, they our sufferings help reveal God and God's glory within our lives and for others to see and know. This first part of the excerpt we have today, reminds us in an important distinction that our earthly existence may have its difficulties, but they should not keep us from

look forward to our heavenly reward. Many people who suffer for a long time ask me, "Why?" And why can't they go to heaven sooner than later. This is a tough question to answer - and I always suggest that this may be our first question we ask God or have answered for us when we arrive in heaven. But in the meantime, our suffering and our live here ***together*** is to support and care for one another. Your suffering helps me learn about my life and God's action in our world. Just as Christ's suffering and dying on the cross helped reveal God's love and salvation, our suffering helps us know more about God and the compassion which comes from our mortal bodies. Hopefully this helps a little in understanding; hopefully it helps us find comfort and support in caring for each other, deepening and sharing our stronger faith.

More questions/answers: My presiding style, as of that of other priests is unique to each one of us. We bring our own little gifts to our sharing in this ministry of prayer leading. You all know we have different talents and we each use what God has given us to witness to our faith and lead you the best possible way. We never preside in a way to hurt or harm you. I find it always curious when people ask each of us priests, "Why can't you be the same?" We are given a basic roadmap for presiding in the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* for the Order of Mass. Like any cook following a recipe, we add our own flavor to the rubrics of Mass, those that are flexible and those that are not, to be able to help us all pray and glorify God a little better. Here are some other questions/answers:

- **Why don't you all sing the Mass?** *This requirement is relaxed for those who are unable to chant or sing the Mass. The first attempt is to sing, for it is printed in the Roman Missal this way. For those unable, the text is then written to be read.*
- **Why do you sing everything some weeks and hardly anything the others?** *Why don't you sing the Eucharistic Prayer each week because it's so special and holy? There is a rubric for liturgy about "progressive solemnities." This principle adheres to the fact that not every liturgy is Easter or Christmas and that we have different seasons of the year that are more special and solemn than others. So for Ordinary Time, you may have noticed we do not use music for many parts of the Mass. For the "high holy seasons," such as Advent, Lent, Christmas, Triduum and Easter Time, we do sing most of the parts of the Mass that are asked to be sung. One good example is "Behold the Lamb of God..." and the response, "Lord, I am not worthy..." or the Lord's Prayer. These are sung during every season but Ordinary Time and I even do this precept for weekdays.*

- **Why do you use your left hand for the blessings?** *Because I am left handed and there is nothing that forbids using one's left hand. God created me with me being "in my right mind." (Hopefully you have heard this joke from other left-handers too!) There is now a rubric for the end of Mass and the final blessing where it is to be done with the right hand, so as you have noticed, I do follow that rubric. This was added for the first time in 2011, but before this was never specified. Incidentally, there is only one other rubric in all of the liturgical rites that is specified for a particular hand, or digit, and that is for confirmation the right thumb must be used.*

I hope you have appreciated the answers as I have enjoyed answering the questions in the Fireside Chat, yellow "suggestion box" and in the regular running of the parish these last 8 years.

Meanwhile, next week we begin our annual "retreat" and prayer time with Saint Ann and Saint Peter Julian Eymard. Come for one, for all or as many times you are able. And please invite your friends, family and neighbors to join us! Share a ride with someone!

Let's continue to pray for each other. And see you next weekend as I preach the Triduum at all the Masses.

- **Weekend Masses July 22/23** – preaching at the Masses and special blessing and gift of medals and prayers; sharing of the relic of Saint Ann for healing strength and other miracles that are needed in our life.
