Info to share from our Pastoral Plan Project of Transparency & Reminders on our Parish Policies:

- We are grateful to so many of you who mention SPB @ Heinen's and use the special code that goes toward our school and the PTO. You generated \$3,088 this past school year. And those of you who save and give us the Box Tops that are collected (along with the Campbell Labels) were able to generate \$1,983.60 toward the school. What does this money go toward? School supplies for the teachers.
- When we had our Walk-a-thon, we raised over \$20,000. These funds were earmarked for technology and a new iPad cart. This was just purchased through the PTO fundraiser (Walk-a-thon) for \$16,199.95. We improve our school all the time – THANKS TO YOU and your HARD work!!
- We have begun a new fiscal year in the parish's life. Thanks for making July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017 so successful and financially sound for our *many* ministries and services that we provide.
- Our calendar has now opened up for you to rent room space for your family events. Just a reminder, we do not ask for a stipend for Funeral luncheons, per parish policy.
- Mass Intentions are now available for the rest of 2017 & 2018.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES APPEAL:

Here is our updated parish summary as of June 30th, 2017:

- Of our 1,970 parish families, 515 participated in the Catholic Charities appeal (26% of our parish); which is up from 17% last year). We've increased our participation with 85 new donors to the campaign!
- 515 donors pledged \$155,439 with \$112,391 received or paid to date, representing 72% fulfillment of our parish goal of \$147,871 from the Catholic Community Foundation. This puts our parish at 105% of our goal! **THANK YOU** once again for supporting the 2017 campaign!

It was a humbling and very moving experience for everyone involved. How truly blessed we are at SPB to have an amazing ministry. This weekend, a few of our teens were sent to Franciscan University of Steubenville for the first time to participate in the 2017 Youth Conference: Elevate. For the past 40 years, high school youth from across the United States have had their faith awakened and their hearts set on a fire through a personal encounter with Jesus at a Steubenville Conference. This year's theme is ELEVATE: From His throne in heaven to the depths of your heart, these words of Jesus are an invitation for you to receive the new life that He alone can give. He wants to break the things that hold you down and give you freedom from sin. He is calling you to follow Him and enter into a transforming experience with His love, grace, and mercy! He can make you new! This summer, we will join with over 50,000 other Catholic teens at one of their 25 youth conferences and experience the joy of following Christ and being elevated by His love. We are grateful for our friends at Queen of Heaven Parish in Green for allowing us to join their Youth Group on this amazing opportunity. 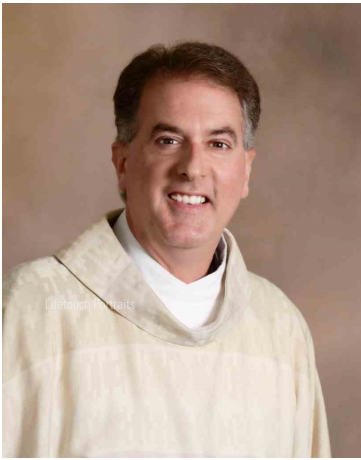

POPE FRANCIS REQUESTS: TAKE THE YOUTH SURVEY!

The Catholic bishops of the world are planning to meet in October 2018. The theme of this gathering is "Youth, Faith and Vocational Discernment." In preparation for this major synod on youth, Pope Francis wants to gather input from the Catholic faithful. Consequently, the Diocese of Cleveland has made available a survey questionnaire. The survey can be found on the diocesan website home page, www.dioceseofcleveland.org. The bishops of the United States pray that the results of this survey will help them more fully understand the experience of young people in our Church and in our country – their hopes, dreams, fears and struggles – so that the synod may bear fruit in offering more insight and direction to our ministry with young people.

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Due to vacations and publication schedule deadlines, this bulletin column and inserts was produced June 19.

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time & Beginning of Saint Ann Triduum: Annually we celebrate good Saint Ann and this weekend we begin our solemn Triduum. While it is normally 3 days, we know that many in our parish work nights, so we extend the Triduum to cover the weekend Masses. It is an honor for me to preach this year's Triduum.

Our Sunday Gospel reminds us that Jesus gives us a parable of hope to help us with the challenges of different people who live around us, not perhaps of the same faith or beliefs. We are to grow together and learn from one another. This is helpful for us to hear, especially in times that we live when fundamentalists, whether Jewish, Muslim or Christian, feel a strong compunction to live in isolation and pure models of like with like and no mixing of people on the earth. This Gospel reminds us that we are to live together – in harmony – and live and grow, learning from one another until the harvest time.

The second reading from Paul's letter to the Romans helps us remember how the Spirit encourages and strengthens us in our difficulties and that God allows the Spirit to move among us to give us that hope and strength. Good Saint Ann is a model for us in our own day at time of how she and other grandmothers have always been there to strengthen and care for us, lending their Spirit, God's Spirit, to lift us up and share in the specialness of being God's children and family. This week of three days will be an opportunity for us to remember the grandmother of Jesus Christ, but also the others in our lives who strengthen and care for us today: see them as you gather together for the Triduum, Monday through Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. It will be a special time of prayer, sacraments and healing in the Risen LORD.

Many feel that SPB is like that too; while we did slow down a bit this summer, we still are having many organizing and planning meetings occurring to set the academic year aright! Improving Our Mass Intentions Feature: I'm sure when you go on vacation and see other bulletins, you learn things about other parishes and get some ideas for our own. I always appreciate when I have that experience and when others share their ideas that they have seen in our parishes. Here's an improvement we will be rolling out of the next year in our "Mass Intention" section of the bulletin: We will list what type of intention we are remembering with the person or couple so that we know if a person is alive, deceased (+), birthday or other anniversary or if it is for prayers for the person, either living or deceased. Here's an example:

- 4:30 p.m. Mass - + Bubba Newman (Prayers)
- 8:00 a.m. Mass - Frieda Jo Williams (Birthday)
- 10:00 a.m. Mass - + Rev. Donald Jette, SSS (Anniv. of death)
- 12:00 p.m. Mass - M/M Joseph Dodger (Wedding Anniv.)
- 7:00 p.m. Mass - Ann Determino (Prayers)

When the priests, sacristans and ushers know this information, it helps us pray in a very helpful way. It also clarifies if there will be someone to bring up the gifts for the Mass intention. We ask the family that is requesting this gift to bring up the bread and wine for Mass and sit next to the credence table in the nave of the church. We also hope you enjoy this new and improved feature in our bulletin.

Report from the Navajo Nation: We received a nice note from Dot Teso, President of Saint Michael Indian School about our visit, giving us an update:

I just wanted to touch base to let you know that as things are calming down here on campus I was thinking of you and Father [Lane], the kids and volunteers who came out this spring. Please share with all that came how much we appreciated your retreat and time with our children. It was so busy on campus after you left that I have not had a minute to reflect on the impact of your visit until now.

Our children expressed an interest in giving the retreat in the Diocese of Gallup to the schools and confirmation classes. I am going to arrange a meeting with the Diocese staff when the children return to school so they can pitch the idea to her. With Christian [one of the student leaders] leading the conversation I think that they will do well. They used many of the skills that you taught them in their sophomore retreat after you left and it was so nice to see.

The [hymnals] have been amazing!!! Our children love the new material and Jamie [our music teacher] is thrilled to have the books (one each for children) at the Mass. The Mass cards are a big hit with our younger grades .. the older kids have found the prayers in the [hymnals].

I know that there is not any way to say thank you enough for all the hard work that your group did for us but please let them all that they remain in our prayers and in our hearts.

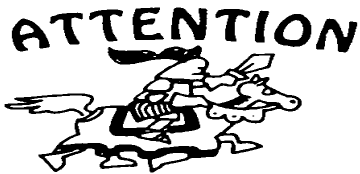
