FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Week 17 in Ordinary Time: I continue my reflection with you on the second reading from Paul's letter to the Romans. This summer I have been using my reading/reflection part of my column to use the opportunity of the second reading to deepen our understanding of this part of the Mass. We continue to hear how God chose us! We are God's special people, made in the image and likeness of God. The lie that is fed to us is that we are not of God, not His children and even though baptized, fall from the grace of that relationship. Paul encouraged the Romans – and now encourages us – that we never fall from

God's grace or relationship and should not ever let sin get in the way of that relationship. If we are to sin, then we are called by God to come back, reconcile and be renewed. This cycle of relating is important – for it's what we need to do even more so with one another. Like God with us, the God of second, third and fourth chances we are to give other chances and continue to build our relationship with one another. As hard as it might be, if we truly love, are truly God's children, we, like God will LOVE NO MATTER what and give another try.

Thank you for Coming to Mass: Any time we have reconstruction or new construction at Mass our attendance takes a dip. I am so grateful that you have not let it alter your stewardship, giving or participation at Mass or other daily activities here at SPB. Thank you, for all your generous support with this project. As you can see elsewhere in the bulletin, as we thank folks who have given a gift to Saint Paschal Lane, we appreciate all you are doing for this emergency project. Thank you for coming to church here in spite of a new parking spot – or even for some families, sitting in a new pew!

One of the Last Payments: The Capital Campaign that the Diocese ran is in its last phase, with a few of our parishioners continuing to submit their pledge payment. We are grateful, for as you may recall, we receive 30% back to the parish from the Rooted in Faith Campaign. Our most recent dividend was \$2,715.00 from the quarterly gifts you shared with the Diocese. Thank you for your commitment to the church, both at the local parish level and at the diocesan level of church life. These funds have been earmarked toward maintenance – and the number one project is our driveway. We will continue to pay off the school, gym and O'Brien Hall roof loans and the driveway loan with your continued support and generosity.

Whatever Happened to the Capital Campaign? When a Diocese does not have a regular bishop in place, all new major projects, such as construction or loans are not able to proceed. Now that we have a new bishop, who will be installed on September 5, we will be able to make a presentation to him in the fall for his blessings on our capital campaign project and then finally begin the first phase, the raising money stage of a campaign. Without a bishop's blessing and approval to raise funds and begin a campaign, we were not able to proceed. With all the hard work we have done as a parish, through our feasibility study, interviews and architectural preliminary drawings, we are confident that in the near future we may focus our efforts on the five areas identified by you, the parishioners: for STEM classrooms to replace the building that had to be torn down, update the computer room and library into a modern learning commons, complete the parking lot and Blue Ribbon Way reconstruction, replace the church windows with energy efficient windows and remodel Father O'Brien Hall, especially for use with our large needs for performance and rehearsal space for our school band.

Continuing the Search: Our search committee recommended to me a candidate to hire over the summer. He declined our offer and went with another parish closer to where his family lives. (He had interviewed at three different parishes in separate parts of the country.) Therefore, we will continue to look for another full-time person to lead our music and liturgy needs on our pastoral staff. Let us continue to pray for the right candidate to come forward to lead this important part of our parish's life.

Reviewing our Policy Manual: Over the summer our Pastoral & Finance Councils and Pastoral Staff have been reviewing our parish policy manual, making recommendations and adding some items, especially since we have voted key aspects to be part of our parish's life. Many of these stem from diocesan policy and Pope Francis. One item stems from the pope's encyclical, *Laudato Si': On Care of Our Common Home*. Recently, Sr. Kathleen Ryan SND reminded us and our Social Action Commission and the diocese in her monthly newsletter that this encyclical turned "two years old." Since we are trying to be a "green parish," recycle, purchase items that do not advance our carbon footprint and more, it is an opportunity for us in our own families to reflect on Francis' vision of the importance of ecology in our life. The summer education tip for this week's bulletin is to reflect on how we are inspired to deepen our life in Christ and in our care for our common home. How can we do so as we help the poor? Consider sharing that inspiration among family, parish and at work. As you do so, consider how much *Laudato Si'* still needs witnesses and evangelizers who uphold its life-affirming, creation-healing message and its urgent call to mutual dialogue on the very real impacts facing the poor and our planet.

Sr. Kathleen mentions: To rekindle your connection with God's creation on this anniversary, Pope Francis suggests in *Laudato Si'* to reclaim your personal story of encounter with the gift and grace of God's creation. Where and when has God's creation moved your heart to stir and your spirit to soar? These graced moments of encounter remind us how creation reveals to us God's closeness and how creation accompanies us in our journey with Christ. Truly gifts to embrace and celebrate, and to keep close to heart this summer in your moments of rest, play or travel!

Eymard Triduum Continues This Week! We enjoy the annual time of extra spiritual care. With Sr. Catherine Caron, SSS not able to physical travel to be with us, she has sent her messages to us in written form. I will proclaim them this week during the Eymard Triduum. I look forward to sharing them Monday thru Wednesday night. Notice the schedule in the bulletin and let's continue to pray for each other!
