## FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



### **From the pastor's perspective...**

**Transfiguration of the LORD:** Feasts of the LORD that fall each year on a specific day (think Christmas!) always get to be celebrated on Sundays. Hence, this year we have the pleasure of celebrating a wonderful mystery in its fullness with a “break” from the green of Ordinary Time and the regular pattern of readings.

This moment is so important in Jesus' life it is celebrated several times throughout the year and on the actual day, the reading of the “cycle” is proclaimed. Since this is Matthew's year, this Sunday we have this Gospel version. Each

Gospel writer highlights an important aspect of the Transfiguration of Christ on Mount Tabor. Matthew does not name the mountain – just that it was high. The disciples fell prostrate and were afraid. They are told not to be afraid. This is a helpful admonition for over and over we need to hear the voice of God say again and again, “You are my beloved!” “Do not be afraid!” We do not have to be afraid because we are always God's children – whether on a mountain or here in the Hillcrest area, we are God's children now and have nothing to fear!

**Construction Update:** I have to heed my own writings, homilies and advice at times and not be afraid when we are doing a construction project, attendance drops due to people's concerns about walking and fears that the project won't end on time. We place a lot of trust in weather and companies, and we know it will get done when it gets done! However, we all need the reminders, the patience, and the trust. We all have experienced minor or major projects in our lives – and they take time and are well worth it! Thank you for sticking with the parish this summer, coming to Mass and supporting the parish with your tithing and sacrificial offerings. As you will see elsewhere in the bulletin, with our pastoral plan goal of financial transparency, the bills and financial needs do NOT take a break in the summer. I am grateful for those who use eOffering, mail in their envelope and are here Sunday after Sunday demonstrating their commitment to God and their parish family. THANK YOU!

**More Gratitude:** We had such a wonderful Saint Ann Triduum, with higher attendance than in the past and wonderful ministers assisting, especially such a beautiful choir. We are grateful to Roberta for leading the choir and the extra special Triduum booklet that she assembled for us (that we will now regularly use in Saint Ann Shrine during the rest of the year) and its prayers, devotions and songs. We continue to pray with Good Saint Ann for strength and healing in our midst; please know that you may request the priest to anoint you at any time before you go for surgery, in need of support and assistance, aging, or whatever. We regularly anoint after the first Sunday of the month at the 8:00 a.m. Mass – but a request for anointing is always possible and part of our ministry here at SPB.

**Welcome Committee:** I am also grateful for our Welcoming Committee and their presence at Highland Heights Home Day. What a great turnout at the park where so many people participated and got to learn about our great parish and its ministries. For those unable to attend, we gave out many info pamphlets, prayer shawls, candy, smiles and more! This is part of our pastoral plan to have this regular outreach of our parish and evangelization, letting our neighbors know we are a faith community, centered on Christ, his Eucharistic mystery and sharing God's love to all.

**Let's pray!** For those who are seeking meaningful employment, having difficulties with health, work and their business and that we all continue to strengthen our faith, hope and love in a God who always lifts us up, lets us know that we are beloved and having nothing to fear! Let us continue to pray for each other!

**Why a profit in the school budget?** *We had an influx of new students and families. (Next year – we are projecting an \$118,000 deficit due to the health care costs of the staff. Please be mindful of our tithing responsibilities and need).*

In the parish's life, this fiscal year's profit is wonderful news, especially since for the first time in 8 years our tithing was actually slightly down \$200,000. We worked hard on cutting expenses as a Pastoral Staff and we appreciate all that you donate to make our parish work so well. It takes a lot of tithing, volunteering and fundraising to help our over 3 million dollar campus run well. We are filled with gratitude!
