22nd Week in Ordinary Time: Today's readings are some of my favorite: the dialogue of Jeremiah and God in the first reading; Psalm 63; Paul exhorting the Romans to be a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God in your spiritual worship; Jesus reminding us that we have taken up our cross to follow the LORD. There are many times along our spiritual journey we may feel duped, the cross too heavy, that we are not pleasing or perfect in the LORD. Yet, this is the temptation of our cross, just as Jesus had His temptation at His cross. Embracing our cross we feel inexpressible joy.

That takes real faith and maturity; that take our souls thirsting for God alone!

Happy 64th Anniversary! While the actual day that Archbishop Hoban started our parish was September 2, we have used Labor Day as our landmark to always remember our founding families with the early Blessed Sacrament Community, led by Fr. John J. O'Brien, SSS. We give thanks to God that we are such a blessed parish, with hard working and dedicated parishioners. For 64 years, we have been a very dynamic parish. SPB CUB SCOUT PACK 555 will have a solemn Flag Retirement ceremony on Saturday September 9th at 7:30 p.m. in the church's main parking lot; the parishioners of SPB are invited to attend. This ceremony follows the tradition of Robert Baden Powell (the founder of Boy Scouts) and allows these young men to provide a service to their parish community. This is a solemn and reverent ceremony - giving honor to our flags that have flown through the years. If you have a flag to be retired, you are welcome to bring it. Some information about what to expect: The Ceremony will begin with a few words about why and how flags are to be retired, and then the Scouts will begin to retire flags. The custom is to burn the flags in reverent silence. Ashes from previous retirements going back to Robert Baden Powell are added to the fire to signify the long lineage of Scouting and Reverence shown by Scouts. Before the flags are placed in the fire, the field of stars is separated from the stripes. The field of stars is never cut to signify the unity of our 50 states. The remains of the flag are then placed on the fire. After all flags have been disposed, the cooled ashes are then collected and some of the ashes are stored until the next ceremony to continue the tradition.
