24th Week in Ordinary Time: Jesus spends a lot of time in Matthew's Gospel speaking about forgiveness, and even prayer and forgiveness and being two sides of the same coin (i.e. think the Lord's Prayer). We are given another look and proclamation of the parable of the non-forgiving servant. Sometimes we hold people "by the throats" for years and year. Does that grip on them really do anything but cause you arthritis? Pope Francis gave the church the gift of the "Year of Mercy" last year. It was a magnificent opportunity to show the same forgiveness to one another as God shows to

us. Other we only know God's mercy if we but open our hearts to forgive again and again and again.

Celebrate Father Roger & 60 Years of Service: We have been blessed to have Fr Roger for so many years of his priesthood right here at SPB. He has had many assignments over the years: Manila, Philippines, here, founding member of the San Antonio Community, pastor of a parish we had in Salt Lake City, parochial vicar in Albuquerque and here again; and of course, enjoying his retirement years with us.
