FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



25th Week in Ordinary Time: Today's parable in the Gospel reminds us that God's wages are far more generous and just than human wages. What is a wage? A fixed payment is one definition. But does God treat us with a "fixed payment?" We know the answer, and it is because of the answer of generosity, love and total care, we know that this same attitude and spirit is required and demanded of each one of us. Perhaps we are not there yet, for we feel mistreated or unfairly cared for by others and God. It's time to rethink this, if this is our attitude. We are challenged to move our hearts if they are fixed on "wage control" to move more

toward a spirit of gratitude and bountiful generosity.

JOIN THE TEAM: It's fall recruitment time. In case you missed Ministry Fair, I encourage you to look at our ministries (especially on our website) and see where your talents and gifts may be shared.

Meanwhile, please consider assisting in some of the liturgical ministries: lector, communion minister, usher, join for an hour of prayer each day as part of our Community at Prayer ministry. Come to see one of the priests or ministers in the sacristy, 20 minutes beforehand and we will give you "on the job training" and some catechesis too. One benefit for being a liturgical minister: the best parking spots!

12:15 p.m. Weekday Mass Assistance: We are pleased that a community has returned to celebrate Mass weekdays at 12:15 p.m. Most who attend this Mass are not parishioners. I would like to invite parishioners and non-parishioners to assist Laura and the priests with the Mass as a regular team of lectors, communion minister and sacristan (getting things ready and cleaning up). Would you be available to help during this Mass, even if you do not regularly attend it? We will help you to be ready for these ministries too.

Relics: We had 25 people attend the tour of the church. I was edified that so many were interested, but especially in the relics. We loan our relics out like a library, for those who need spiritual benefit, preparing for surgery or health care or other items. Let me know and, like a library, we will loan you our parish relics of Saints Paschal Baylon, Paul, Peter Julian Eymard and a few others.

What is Stewardship? Needs Are Great: Stewardship is a great part of who we are. From the Bible, we learn the ways and commitment to share 10% of our time, talent and treasure back to God. That's 10% back of our time, 10% of our talent and 10% of treasure. To much has been given, much is expected! We are very blessed people – and because of this we are called to share. That also takes some planning and care, especially with so many needs out there. This year, especially with Hurricanes Harvey and Irma, our own emergency to replace Saint Paschal Lane, and I'm sure your own family emergencies. We give, because we are good and faithful stewards – and Christians taking our call seriously to share with those in need. THANK YOU for identifying the causes and needs that support you and your families' talents. But especially, thank you for tithing and caring about SPB and its future and its legacy. A wonderful parish has been handed on to us so that we may build it up with the reign of God for the next generation.

Thinking ahead, please note that we will have Dominican Father Scott Steinkerchner here again to preach for "Food for the Poor." Each year we do some international outreach to remind our parish we are part of the global

community: thanks for supporting this ministry October 21/22. In the meantime, thanks for praying, budgeting and being generous with the blessings God has given you!
