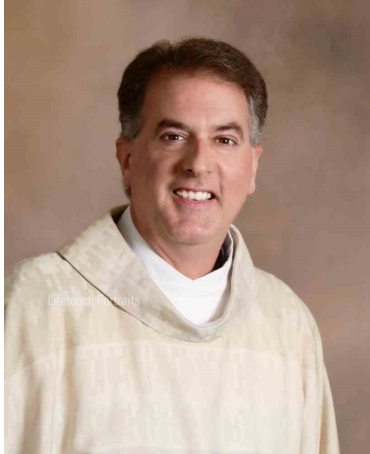

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



28th Sunday in Ordinary Time: What Shall I Wear to prepare for the wedding banquet? This is the question asked of the Matthew community centuries ago, and the question that is for us even today. We were baptized in Christ and put on the clothes of virtue, love, compassion and much more. Are we ready to share these gifts of the banquet? This is our call even today. And not only that, but to go out to share this welcoming message of inclusion into the streets and workplaces, to help other see that they have a place at the table and are called to get ready for the heavenly banquet. We keep deepening our mission; we keep getting ready!

Respect Life Month Continues: Over the last few weeks, we have had holy cards in the pews education us about the Oklahoma City priest and martyr Stanley Rother. He is the first USA born priest to be beatified, the second last step toward canonization. He served the final 13 years of his life with the people of Santiago Atilan, Guatemala in a village, plowing the fields alongside his parishioners. He was extremely concerned and showed it through his steward leadership that the earth and people are extremely sacred and that the leaders of the country needed to respect the lives of these people. Fr. Rother was martyred in his parish rectory for his standing up with the poor and helping the farmers' rights. His life and death reminds us of the special model of holiness, respect and care we are to have everywhere and to speak out against injustice when we see it.

Blessing of Health Care Workers: We are blessed to have so many people in our parish who work in the health care field. We live in Medical City USA – nowhere on earth do you have such excellent health care – four great chains! We are blessed – and we want to help those in the field continue the mission of caring and curing. In honor of Saint Luke, the patron of health care, we will have our annual blessing after the homily next weekend at all the Masses.

Anointing of the Sick on Saint Luke Day – Wednesday, October 18: Another tradition we keep holy is celebrating the sacrament of the sick on Saint Luke's feast day. After the homily, we will celebrate this other sacrament in the context of Mass.

Looking to the Poor: We have all been struck by the terrible weather related tragedies in our country, but especially in the Caribbean. The island countries have been devastated. Please note that we will have Dominican Father Scott Steinkerchner here again to preach for "Food for the Poor." Each year we do some international outreach to remind our parish we are part of the global community: thanks for supporting this ministry October 21/22.
