## FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



**29<sup>th</sup> Week in Ordinary Time:** Today Jesus gets the “stewardship” talk from the Pharisees, in a plot trying to trap him. We may fall into the same plot within ourselves, failing to see that all really belongs to God. What on earth is ours? We are partners in creation with God – but all is God’s: the earth and all contained within it. We can get caught up in the minutia of taxes, but Christ is asking for our hearts and our complete devotion to making sure that we always give God the Glory.

**Stewardship:** This Sunday’s scripture reminds us of our duty to be faithful to God and one another in caring for one another, but especially our society. Through the Bible, we are invited into a partnership of caring for one another, a covenant that extends in Christianity through our baptism and discipleship. We are to tithe, or give 10% back to God – first! Then the rest is for us to use for the livelihood we have. Why to God first? Since from the beginning of generosity, it’s about recognizing that all comes from God and so the “first fruits” should then be returned to God in thanksgiving for God’s many blessings to us. We continue this tradition today, by showing our thanksgiving and gratitude by first sharing our gifts with God through the Christian community. Many feel it’s not the church’s duty to talk about money or expound on the needs. Yet, it is a topic often discussed in scripture and a reality of creating a Christian community through the sharing of resources. “To those much has been given, much is expected,” as scripture says, so that we may be church and proclaim the Gospel through our ministries.

SPB has so many wonderful ministries! Thanks for always remembering to tithe to God through this “people/community of faith.” “We are God’s people, the sheep of the flock,” and we repay to God what is God’s! Thank you for this powerful witness of tithing – through 10% of your time, 10% of your talent and 10% of your treasure!

**Our New Music- Liturgy Minister:** Your tithing supports the salaries of our excellent staff – and we have one new person to complete our staff. We thank you for your prayers over this interim period. Upon the recommendation of the Search Committee, led by Fr. John, the parish is hiring **TONY WARD** to be our new pastoral associate for music & liturgy. Tony, his wife and four children, currently live in Independence, MO. They will be immediately transitioning to our area. Starting October 30, Tony will (and maybe even the weekend before), start his ministry with us.

During this interim time between music/liturgy ministers, I thank Michelle Kitko, who has been so gracious and wonderful in planning the music selections we sing and keeping us on task, organized and leading the 10:00 a.m. and Noon music groups. I also thank Roberta Modica for her leadership, service and the extra things she took on with joy and love. As always, we count on our senior accompanist, Matt Parrotta, our steady rock of accompaniment, his leadership and care of the past 25 years. Julie Parrotta has still remained an active parishioner, even though she works for another parish! We thank Julie for leading the 7:00 p.m. music group (teen choir) and for her volunteering at school Masses. Lastly, we thank Fr. John for his leadership and tireless efforts to work with the search committee, for their many interviews, questions, repeated questions and auditions. It was a long and good process. Thank you

too, our dear parishioners, for your prayers, support and active, conscious participation in the music and liturgy of our parish. We know that you count on great music and preaching and we are proud to say that we regularly share this gift with our community.

**Welcome Back Fr Scott:** We have all been struck by the terrible weather-related tragedies in our country, but especially in the Caribbean. The island countries have been devastated.
