FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



30th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Do you keep lists to organize your thoughts, ideas or shopping? Here I'm revealing a personal habit that keeps me "together," and helps me do what I need to do and say what I need to say. In today's Gospel, Jesus truly streamlines and simplifies the lists of rules and regulations that any good Jew knew in their mind and heart by encapsulating the commands, regulations and such in just two important instructions. We call these two commandments the "golden rule." They put together succinctly what is so important for living "for God" and for God's people. If we truly love, first God, then ourselves and others, we have summarized and put our lists

into one purpose for our one being. I know it is taking a lifetime for me to simplify and pull my list together: but when we do so, we are truly loving and living and being in a special communion with God – the being of all love. Let's keep working on #1 & #2 on "our list," and recognize that God will help us love, for God shows us how to love perfectly.

500 Years: This weekend, Christian churches throughout the world are marking a special, but sad anniversary: the beginning of the reformation of Christianity and the great second division of Christianity. We forget sometimes about the first one – in 1054 when the Roman pontiff changed the creed without permission from all the bishops of the world and henceforth created the Orthodox and Catholic churches. This second break of Christian unity, because of so many reasons, led to even further separation of churches throughout the centuries. What will bring us back? Leaders like us - hoping, praying and working for Christian unity. We are fortunate that at the Second Vatican Council, a document and vision of Christian unity was brought back to the forefront of Christian life. This week, when we remember the 500th anniversary of when Martin Luther posted his 95 theses - his reform movement to the church - we remember that we are constantly reforming, growing and seeking to become one again. And we pray that Christians and our leaders will never tire of trying to bring the Body of Christ back together again. It is one of the joys of my ministry to represent our parish in the Hillcrest Area religious leaders: to pray, work and bring about unity through our common love of one another, members of the Body of Christ.

Thanksgiving Service: In an effort to "practice what we preach," each year we have gathered to be part of a Thanksgiving Prayer Service for all in our Hillcrest area. In the last few years, we have broadened our scope to add other faith traditions such as Buddhist, Jewish and Muslim faith traditions. This year, our parish has been chosen to host the Thanksgiving Prayer Service: **Tuesday, November 21, 7:00 p.m.** We ask you to place this on your calendar. Let us worship this national holiday in solidarity and show our desire to be one nation, one people under God, truly thankful for God's many blessings and gifts in our lives.

Annual Meeting on Parish Finances: We had a wonderful meeting on October 11 with the leaders of the parish where we reviewed parish finances. We are all encouraged to look at our tithing commitment and see what we are able to do to increase our giving to make our financial obligations. Our school and parish staff health care costs and other benefits have increased. We also gave an increase of 3% to our staffs, due to the cost of living increases and support that our parish staff needs. We are grateful for all the sacrifices you make – and as you read in the bulletin each week, we share our regular expenses. People do not give a break to the church with bills; therefore we have to work hard to make our financial commitments. Elsewhere in the bulletin's stewardship report, we share, as suggested in our pastoral plan, some of our regular bills.

Updated Parish Policy: “Where does it say that?” Any time a parishioner, or non-parishioner asks for something from the parish and our policy, people wish to know where they can find the policy and the reason behind it. Over the last 6 months, we have been reviewing our policies and adding to the list. It is now online on our website. At our recent Quarterly meeting, when the leaders of the parish are present for important deliberations, with all Pastoral Council and most Finance Council members present, we voted unanimously to approve the policy manual. Additionally, to use our facilities, we have revised this policy and “rental agreement” of our spaces. This is also on our website.
