FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



31st Sunday in Ordinary Time: We have all heard the phrase – and have even said it – “practice what you preach.” Paul in his letter to the Thessalonians also reiterates the Gospel message from Matthew too: We [are] determined to share with you not only the Gospel of God but our very selves as well. We share ourselves – yes our very being is quite important and how we work, toil and pray is important in framing our lives in faith. We each act on God’s word and live it accordingly, no matter what our title or our position. As we move toward the end

of this liturgical year, these are great reminders that humble us and help us serve one another better by the authentic living of our lives in faith.

Welcome Aboard! Beginning officially on November 1, our new music and liturgy minister, Tony Ward began serving with us at SPB. You may have read in our quarterly newsletter around the church, *Paschal Life*, some of the details in Tony’s life, so I won’t repeat all the details here. I know you’ll give Tony, his wife and four children a warm welcome here. We are overjoyed that Tony will be sharing his many talents with us. As we move into the seventh year of the update *Roman Missal*, and updated texts for the parts of Mass, he has selected the *Mass of Joy & Peace* in our hymnal as our new Mass setting for the coming year.
