Bequests are exempt from federal estate taxes, and types of bequests include:

Residuary Bequest: The remainder of the estate after payment of all debts, taxes, expenses and other bequests can be left to your parish

Percentage Bequest: St. Paschal Baylon Parish will receive a percentage of the residuary estate

Specific Bequest: A specific dollar amount or item of property is designated to St. Paschal Baylon Parish

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time: For three Sunday weeks of the church's liturgical readings we take time to focus on the 25th chapter in the Gospel of Matthew. It's a key chapter, written just before the passion, death and resurrection of Christ. It is like Matthew and Jesus purposely got together to write the important testimony to live out life. Kimberly Hope Belcher, a professor of theology and liturgy at the University of Notre Dame writes in *Give Us This Day*, page 197:

The third servant in today's parable understands something about the master of the universe that we may forget: God is not ashamed to harvest where another has planted and to gather what someone else has scattered. God has the audacity to take even the evil planted by the enemy and turn it into a rich harvest of good—to see in misshapen fruit, rich food for the hungry, or in this year's rotting vegetables, next year's compost. God sees our future in the wounds of our past. ... Instead of counting up blemishes, we reach out our hands to the poor and extend our arms to the needy.

We are blessed that we stand together as a community of faith, following our patron saint, Paschal Baylon, who led in the same way, mindful of his talents, not thinking he had much to offer, but instead using his gifts to care for the needy. May we continue to do the same! We have the talents – let us use them for the good.
