## FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



**4<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time:** Today's scriptures cause us to reflect on our anxieties (Paul to the Corinthians), our hard hearts or stubbornness (psalm) and Christ's first teaching experience in Capernaum. The unclean spirit recognized him and wanted to create confusion. This same confusion is created in our own world by the devil and all those minions of unclear, awful spirits that work to make us more restless and even more fixed. We are invited by our sacred texts to hear again Jesus rebuking the bad spirits in and around us that cause our hearts to not beat in sync with God's heart and to return to

a special harmony that will free us from worry and distress.

**Winter Recruitment Drive:** With the readings today, it's a great time to remind you of our winter recruitment drive. Here are a few needs and short job descriptions:

- **New Head Usher** - attends Liturgy Commission meetings as a liaison to the ushers and staff, works with the pastor and music/liturgy minister to recruit ushers for Masses, but especially schedules the ushers for the extra liturgies throughout the year.
- **Wedding Sacristan** - with the Music/Liturgy Minister, coordinates the rehearsal for the bridal party and on the wedding day sets up the items for Mass (like a weekend or weekday Mass) and helps line up the bridal party and recruit altar servers for the wedding liturgy.
- **Leaders for Children's Liturgy of the Word** - sets up the Eymard Room, prepares the readings from the Children's lectionary, copies the activity (in the parish office), leads the reading, singing of the Alleluia (optional) and has fun with our children! Best if you have a helper or two with you - some come as a team.
- **Cantors, instrumentalists** - You have probably heard the 4:30 Saturday with the dynamic duo of Sr. Angela and Celine on violin and flute, respectively; Dick and Carla at 8:00 a.m. on Sunday with guitar and percussion; and Steve K. (organ), Steve E. (trumpet) and Jeff (trumpet and bass) at 10:00 a.m.; but how about sharing your musical gifts of voice and instrument?
- **Spring Fling Volunteers** - Our 9<sup>th</sup> annual parish festival is Thursday, May 17 (Saint Paschal Day) through Sunday, May 20. A volunteer coordinator or just sharing an hour or two is always needed. - **Funeral Altar Servers** - Just like a regular Mass except for the procession at the beginning and the end; even if you have never been an altar server before, we will train you to assist the priest and the family for the Mass. **Journey Program - Scripture-based small groups!** Part of our Pastoral Plan (and we are now in Year 4) is small faith-sharing groups. We have had the ARISE program for the last 3 years. With this Lent, we will begin a new program called "Journey." Please sign up and meet some of your parishioners here or with our cluster parish, Saint Clare, who participate on either campus depending on the day of the week, morning, afternoons and evenings.

**Catholic Schools Week Begins:** This year's theme is: "Learn. Serve. Lead. Succeed." How true this is! As we learn once again what our scriptures tell us about Christ's calling of the disciples, may we faithfully serve, and then lead. In doing this, we will succeed! We have in this parish for 65 years – may God continue to bless us and continue his saving work – building the kingdom of God. It's time to register for the new school year. Tours are always conveniently available by our staff. Just call for an appointment or see elsewhere in the bulletin with our principal column the specific times for tours this week.

**Capital Campaign and Growth for the future of the parish:** As of the writing of this column (January 7 due to vacation and holidays), we are still waiting approval to raise funds for our "Faith, Hope and Love" campaign. Let me review with you the five priorities that you voted upon last year from a list of 13 that were identified by our parishioners:

- Add two permanent STEM classrooms to the school, to replace the two classrooms that were a mobile building that lasted 15 years past their prime ☺
- Remodel the computer lab and library into a 21<sup>st</sup> century Learning Commons
- Continue to renovate the parking lot and replace Blue Ribbon Way drive by Father O'Brien Hall
- Replace single pane windows in church with new energy-efficient windows
- Remodel Father O'Brien Hall (expand kitchen and storage, extend the building for our school band( - the largest Catholic elementary school band in the area -) rehearsal area and our after-school programs)

# LENT

While Lent is a few weeks away, it's good to start thinking and preparing for this holy season, changing calendars, organizing our families to think of participating in the following:

- **JOURNEY, FAITH-SHARING GROUP:** When we wrote our Pastoral Plan 3 years ago, members said that they wanted more opportunities to get together to learn about scripture, meet new parishioners and share their faith. Join in a group either here or with our cluster mates, Saint Clare, for a group that meets in the morning afternoon or in the evening at either location.
- **BIBLE STUDY:** Men gather on Tuesday evenings in the parish office at 7:00 p.m. There is a mixed gender group that meets on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 p.m.
- **WEEKDAY MASSES:** Come one day a week to one of our many weekday Masses: Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at 9:00 a.m. and 12:15 p.m.; Thursday, Friday and Saturday at 9:00 a.m. or Saint Ann Shrine on Monday through Friday at 11:30 a.m.
- **SUNDAY MASS:** Come early to review the readings – give yourself more time by preparing for Mass with your family – and arrive on time to hear the preludes and other pieces by our music ministry. Or for those who leave early from Mass – plan on staying for the entire liturgy.
- **MORNING OR EVENING PRAYER:** Join with the Blessed Sacrament Community that leads the prayers of the church, 8:00 a.m. or 4:45 p.m. weekdays. Twenty minutes of prayers, intercessions, the recitation of the psalms
- **PRAYER IN THE PRESENCE OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT:** When driving in the area, make a visit to the chapel to spend more time in prayer, or even better, make an appointment with God by signing up for an hour of praying with the Community at Prayer ministry.
- **OPERATION RICE BOWL:** Make sure to have a rice bowl on your table so that you may be in communion with those who need food. Follow the calendar that is provided to grow in our awareness of the needs of our brothers and sisters around the globe.
- **STATIONS OF THE CROSS:** Join in this special devotion either with the entire community, Friday night at 7:00 p.m. or at another time during the week on your own.
- **PLAN ON ATTENDING THE PARISH MISSION AND BRING OTHERS WITH YOU:** February 25 – 28, 7:00 p.m. in the evening, plus the Eymard Spiritual Group, Tuesday, February 27 at 1:00 p.m.
- **SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:** We have many opportunities for the sacrament to be celebrated individually or communally:
  - **Students First Penance:** Wednesday, February 21, 7:00 p.m.
  - **Saturdays:** 3:30 p.m. until the last one is there in line
  - **Wednesday, February 28, pick a time between 5:00 – 8:00 p.m.** The Diocesan Night of Confession at every church in the diocese that is able
  - **PSR Students:** Monday, March 12 at 6:30 p.m.
  - **Tuesday, March 13, 7:00 p.m.** Communal Rite 2
  - **Thursday, March 22:** Saint Clare at 7:00 p.m.
- **TAIZE PRAYER:** Monday, March 26, 7:00 p.m. A holy hour of prayer
- Call a friend; visit the sick; volunteer in a ministry to share, live your discipleship and faith

**And those Old Palm Branches:** It's our annual custom to burn our old palms branches for the ashes. If you forgot to bring your palm branch back to church, have no fear! You may bring it back at any time. We invite you to bring them to the central Fickel Narthex at any time and we will take care of them for you.

**Ash Wednesday is February 14:** This year, as in past years, we have an array of times to help you begin your Lenten journey. Most of our services are with Mass – and the distribution of the ashes follows the homily of the Mass. Masses are at 6:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m., 12:15 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.

We once again will offer a Service of the Word in which there is no Eucharist Prayer; it is not a Mass. Here's the order of the service, which will be held at 4:00 p.m.

- Opening Song
- Collect (Opening Prayer)
- Reading (of the day from the prophet Joel)
- Psalm (of the day)
- Homily on the Word of God (Deacon Joe leading)
- Blessing and Distribution of Ashes (we will need many helpers)
  - Music during this time – usher holding baskets for the collection – two of them, one for our parish and the other to help Eastern Europe Churches
- Closing Prayer and Song

With many ministers to assist Deacon Joe, who is leading this year's service, it would be about 20 – 25 minutes. Thanks for signing up and we look forward to sharing our Lenten journey together.

## SYMBOLON THE CATHOLIC FAITH EXPLAINED
