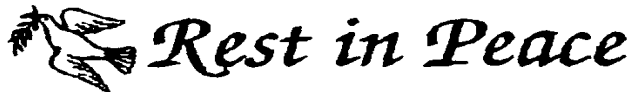

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



3rd Sunday of Lent: We are using the “Year B Cycle” readings this year – instead of Cycle A, so we hear of Jesus’ cleansing of the temple. For some reason, this reading, being heard at the beginning of March (thinking Spring!), I couldn’t help but think of “spring cleaning.” I love to clean. This may seem surprising to some who know me 😊 However, there is something about accomplishing this task and the “clean smell.” We know that Christ was getting to a deeper meaning about what “consumed him” and the cleaning he was hoping for with the greedy merchants and those taking advantage of the poor at the great temple in Jerusalem. As Lenten pilgrims, we yearn for some

cleaning, renewal and perhaps a lot of HGTV remodeling. We can point to others in our society that we would wish to do some major cleaning. But for now, let’s start with ourselves and find the peace and cleansing that will bring about a “freshness” into our own temple. Let us hold fast to our Lenten resolutions that we make to deepen our spirituality and refine our temple.
