FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Due to the holiday, this bulletin is produced March 30 – April 1.

Third Sunday of Easter:

Today's Gospel is often called "The Emmaus Story or Journey." It gives us the naming of the Eucharist: The Breaking of the Bread. This was how they often identified

what we now call the "Order of Mass." This story recounts a journey with two disciples, who are really us! We walk with the LORD, hearing God's Word in our lives, having it interpreted, discussed, and realizing that at some point, Christ has never left us. Christ is always present, but often we cannot recognize this. Perhaps this is why we often say "The Confiteor" at Mass or at other times in our lives: the sins of omission – not seeing what we could readily see if our eyes were open. We come again and again to the Eucharistic table to have better sight and to never fail to see Christ's presence. Look – again by your side! Christ is in the Word, the assembly – you and me and in the Body & Blood, Eucharistic elements of bread and wine, transformed like us into Christ's Body. Be what you receive!

Triduum & Easter Time THANKS! One of the best things about my role as pastor is hearing all the compliments and passing them along to all the hard-working people who work or share their discipleship here at SPB. At the end of the Easter Vigil, the last of the three night services, I especially thank the array that has helped produce our marvelous Triduum liturgies. For those not able to hear me, I repeat my list again – for we can never thank them enough:

Questions & Answers from the Suggestion Box & Pastoral Council Meeting of March 16: Meanwhile, here’s a feature you have grown to love coming back when you least expect it!

- ***Why didn’t we have a cross in the sanctuary during Lent?***

We highlighted the biggest cross in the state of Ohio this Lent: the one **outside** of our church. I recently had lunch with our parishioner and architect Richard Fleischman. He shared with me again the reason for the cross outside and “in front of the church,” the building – the people! “The cross is always leading us forward as we walk in faith. It’s meant to be an active symbol in the design to lead us forward in faith, but also a reminder to those who see it from the street that the cross is celebrated inside this church, this place of people – the Body of Christ. It’s meant to be in two worlds and place – and with a glass church you are able to make the multi-layered connections.”

- ***What is the reason in our day for covering statues during Lent?***

This custom comes from a long history of wishing to focus on the interior of ourselves and not on the externals, such as the saints or other items that are part of the rest of our lives. Lent is introspective – and then, like the first disciples, for Easter Time and other seasons, we go out to share the Good News.

- ***We need new Stations of the Cross books and a ritual book.***

Noted and something our Liturgical Commission will discuss and invest time and money in for the future.

- ***No more political homilies, please!***

Hmm, this is an interesting comment and wish we knew more about what the person was referring to. Sometimes sharing about Catholic social teaching is upsetting – for it may sound political or that there is a position that the Catholic Church has – and we do. It may be something you do not know about, agree with or completely understand. Homilies are meant to enlighten, challenge and inform us, too. As our preaching teachers like to say, if we get folks a little uncomfortable and thinking – we are doing our job well. But additionally, this is why we have reformed our Catholic Social Action Commission – to help educate, inspire and act. We will be having an information night on immigration **Tuesday, May 29 at 7:00 p.m.** So, this will be an opportunity to share more information, learn more and have the time to digest the information – more than one is able to absorb in an 8-minute homily. Jesus laid out our Catholic Social Teachings in Matthew Chapter 25.
