CLOWN/HELPING HANDS MINISTRY

The Easter spirit continues to be seen throughout Saint Paschal Baylon parish. The Clown and Helping Hands ministry is sharing that spirit by continuing to reach out to those in need. A number of people have asked me if we have seen a change in the numbers or in the people we try to assist. A recent article in *Catholic Magazine* titled, “Poor Americans”, stated that the United States is one of the world’s richest, most powerful and technologically innovative countries, but neither its wealth nor its technology is being harnessed to address the situation in which 40 million people continue to live in poverty. At the heart of much day-to-day struggle among the nation’s poor is the persisting lack of access to adequate care and other basic needs. Our ministry cannot fill all needs for everyone, but we do provide a hot meal, clothing and toiletries. We go beyond that and find out a little about each person – like their name and birthday. We give them a birthday gift and of course, provide special holiday meals. At Christmas, Santa visits those under the bridges or in abandoned buildings. The people are not just poor people; they are part of our church. WE ARE FAMILY. When we recognize this, we begin to realize that we need to take care of one another and share what we have been given. GOD IS GOOD ALL THE TIME. ALL THE TIME GOD IS GOOD.

THE SYMBOLON CATHOLIC FAITH EXPLAINED

Session 5: Who Is Jesus?

No one who has ever lived has had a greater impact on the world than Jesus of Nazareth, and the question of Jesus' identity is central to our faith. The question Jesus asked the Apostles, "But who do you say that I am?" is the same question he asked each of us. How we answer his question makes all the difference for our lives. The Spiritual Formation Committee of St Clare and St Paschal invite you to take a step toward a deeper and richer experience of your Catholic faith that will last a lifetime.

This is the fifth of a 10-part study of the Catholic faith entitled *Symbolon*. We will gather once a month to reflect on God's plan of salvation for us, basing our study on the Creed. FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



4th Sunday of Easter: Today's Gospel reminds us why Christ died for us on the cross: God loves us. A good shepherd loves and knows the sheep and does anything for the sheep. That's a dedicated shepherd! Why would a shepherd do that, for smelly, dirty, not the brightest animals on the planet? That's no worry or care for our God.

What is remarkable is that God cares no matter what for whomever! This gives us hope and affirmation as we try to be the best servers of a servant God!

Thank you from the Mission 20: I'm writing this column as we fly back from our youth group mission trip to Saint Michael Indian School in Arizona. On behalf of Evamarie, our youth minister, we thank you for your generosity. Our trip was a financial and prayer-filled success. We had an incredible group of young people and adult chaperones who worked hard to help transform the old convent of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament into a retreat center bedroom, building 20 beds, painting, cleaning, etc. Our group worked so well together.

We cannot thank you enough for your financial support. And, the prayer requests you gave us, that we kept in our hearts throughout the trip, but especially as we went to the holy shrine of Chimayo, in northern New Mexico, inspired us as we took on your cares, concerns and worries and brought them to the LORD and this sacred space. Our youth had so many highlights from the trip, and we hope to have them share their experiences with you along the way. We felt you with us with your prayers – and it meant so much to us. In a special way we thank our chaperones: The Kess Family, the Anderson Family, Ed Dulzer and the Boone-Catanese Family. Now we pray for our next trip – hopefully to our SSS parish and school in NYC. Details are in process! We love witnessing the gifts of the Eucharist!

Questions/Answers from the Trip: Driving with 4 smart theologians in my van and having time with our youth at meals, we had such wonderful times to chat about many great things. I was able to answer many questions from our group. However, based on this year's Easter Vigil questions and my group, I wanted to clear up one misconception: The Easter Vigil, the most holy night of our liturgical year, yes, even bigger than Christmas, DOES COUNT AS YOUR EASTER MASS OBLIGATION, as it is the LORD'S Day!! You do not have to go again to church on Easter Sunday – though no one is stopping you from going to church again!

Additionally, Saturday Masses, after 4:00 p.m. "COUNT" AS SUNDAY MASSES! Our liturgical calendar as Roman Catholic Christians is different than the civic time, Jewish time or other clocks. As Christians, we follow the LORD'S Day. In our English language we call it "Sunday," but in other romance languages, it translates always as "The LORD'S Day." And this is a "longer day of the week," at 36 hours, beginning at 4:00 p.m. and continuing until the next Midnight on Monday morning. There are two settings of Evening Prayer, from the Liturgy of the Hours that help us understand the length of the LORD'S Day. We do not celebrate "the Christian Sabbath." The Sabbath Day is Jewish – and is "clocked from sunset to sunset," just 24 hours depending on the time when the sun sets. Our LORD GOD did rest on the Sabbath, but Christ rose on the first day of the week, now called "The LORD'S Day," transforming so much, but especially our sense of the day of rest and the day **for the LORD.**

Ramadan Dinner: As part of the Muslim faith, during the holy month of Ramadan, they are inspired by service to cook and care for people **outside** of their faith. This is why each year they offer to provide a meal for us during this special liturgical time. Please call the parish office to register and share fellowship and hospitality with our neighbors and friends throughout the Hillcrest area who follow a different religion, but share in the same love of God and neighbor. Join us together in the Eymard Room, **Thursday, May 24.**

Want to Become Catholic? Each year we begin the formal process to join the Roman Catholic Church in August. However, we realize that people think, or discern, all year long.
