## FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



***The Most Holy Trinity:*** Today we hear the echo of the commandment of Christ to “go, make disciples, baptize in the name of the Trinity, and then teach them to observe the commandments.” And that Christ is always with us! How are we doing? One of the chief aspects of our church life is evangelization – living and sharing the Gospel – the Good News! As Paul’s letter to the Romans highlights, “we are children of God.” The Rite of Baptism

rubrics ask that infants are baptized in the context of the community and Sunday Mass so that we may highlight that they are part of the children of God, family of Christ and that they our heirs. We are to teach them and share the faith in the context of a community of welcoming and caring.

So I ask the question again, “How are we doing?” Our faith, commandments and traditions are not for ourselves, but to be shared, and this celebration of the mystery of the Trinity helps us focus. In a couple of days, with the Pastoral Council and Pastoral Plans mandate, we will be having a picnic and time to regather our Evangelization Committee. This is a core part of our parish life and being a Christian. We are disciples of Christ for our God, but called to live, and encourage others to join in our faith. By reforming this committee, we will gather, in the Holy Spirit, to identify ways that our parish can truly highlight these commands of Christ, but even further, develop efforts to improve our evangelization ways. ## PSR AND OTHER NEWS FROM THE PEKO'S

**Registration:** Registration is now underway for the 2018-2019 PSR school year.

Forms were sent home with current students in early April. Additional forms will be available from the Parish Office and on <http://psr.saintpaschal.com> (click on "Registration Form" on the left sidebar.) For an early tuition rate, register before August 1st. Early tuition rates for this year are \$85 for 1 child, \$155 for 2 children, and \$230 for 3 or more children. **Scholarships are available.** Additionally, our registration form also serves as the emergency medical form as well as the media release form for your convenience. **Special note:** Two years of sacramental preparation is required. If you have a child entering 1<sup>st</sup> grade or 7<sup>th</sup> grade and are interested in them receiving their sacraments in 2<sup>nd</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades the following year, please make sure to enroll them in PSR for this coming school year.
