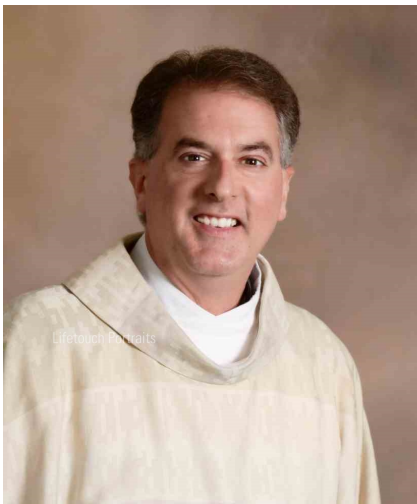

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



10th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Our Sunday Gospel's now return to the regular cycle of the lectionary and liturgical year after two "extraordinary" Sundays, focusing on important mysteries of our faith. We are now back in a continuous order of the Gospel of Mark, picking up again at chapter 3. Jesus has been off preaching, teaching and healing and he is returning home. But his home life has gotten more complicated with fame. With all the rhetoric

surrounding him, he instructs us to hold to the truth and recognition that only God does good works and that we are all to do God's work and not put an end or stop to it. Satan can do many tricks, spread false information and cause divisions, as we hear in the first reading from Genesis. However, we need to believe in the honest-to-goodness spirit that first came from Christ and then flows from disciples to disciples for generations – and then to us! As Paul in today's second reading boldly states: "We, too, believe and therefore we speak." Sometimes we are not able to go "home" to say these things; hopefully, like me, you are able and continue to see your part in doing God's good work!

Evangelization: One element of our church and parish life is evangelization – living, sharing, talking and welcoming others into the faith. How can we do this better as a parish? Tomorrow night, **Monday, June 11, 6:30 p.m.** on the parish deck (or inside the SSS dining room if inclement weather persists), we will have a picnic and discussion on this. Please make sure you sign up by calling the front office and letting me know. If you would be so kind to bring a side dish to share.

Ramadan Dinner Follow-Up: We had a great experience of community a few days ago, sharing food, fellowship, culture and our global concerns with one another. We are grateful to our Turkish American Muslim friends, who for the sixth year, kept the custom of sharing a dinner with us. Part of the Muslim faith is to feed others not of your faith during their liturgical month of Ramadan. We also had very deep conversations on what our concerns are today: world peace, education, disparity of wealth and the environment being severely harmed (especially by plastics). It is interesting to learn how educated our friends are and how they fled Turkey for a better life here due to persecution, social injustice or just wanting a better education for one's self. We continue to be grateful for this partnership and witness of two faith communities growing together in the Hillcrest area, but also many from Solon.

Summertime fun: There's a great deal of summer maintenance occurring, especially in the school. We thank you for your continued support and tithing as we complete our regular improvements. We are adding a wall and dividing one of the preschool classrooms, to make two classrooms (for we have expanded our preschool program for next year!) Secondly, the computer lab and library are being refreshed for the new technology coming in, the Bourgeois Broadcast Booth and the redesigned library area now all being called the Jansky Learning Center. We also have the following spiritual events that I hope you have placed on your calendar:

We are a stewardship parish: we recognize that as God's stewards, we cannot help but give thanks to God for our many blessings and gifts. We demonstrate this by sharing our time, talent and treasure to build up God's reign. We do this because there are a lot of joys and blessings, expenses and duties for living and running a parish family: Here are some of the bills we paid this week:

Our first collection supports paying these bills and our parish staff and its salary, benefits and pension: \$18,961.70

Our second collection supports our repayment of our loan to Key Bank on our roofs in the school, the gym and Father O'Brien Hall: \$2,935.00

Catholic Charities Appeal: Each year we are asked to support the many ministries of the Diocese of Cleveland, especially its outreach ministries. PSR AND OTHER NEWS FROM THE PEKO'S

Registration: Registration is now underway for the 2018-2019 PSR school year. Forms were sent home with current students in early April. Additional forms will be available from the Parish Office and on <http://psr.saintpaschal.com> (click on "Registration Form" on the left sidebar.) For an early tuition rate, register before August 1st. Early tuition rates for this year are \$85 for 1 child, \$155 for 2 children, and \$230 for 3 or more children. **Scholarships are available.** Additionally, our registration form also serves as the emergency medical form as well as the media release form for your convenience.

Special note: Two years of sacramental preparation is required. If you have a child entering 1st grade or 7th grade and are interested in them receiving their sacraments in 2nd and 8th grades the following year, please make sure to enroll them in PSR for this coming school year.
