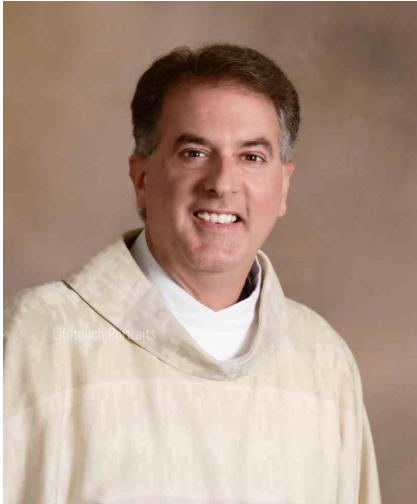

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



John the Baptist's Birth: Today we celebrate one of the special solemnities of the church's life: the nativity of Saint John the Baptist. Being a solemnity, we sing almost everything we know for the Mass, celebrate with incense, and bring out the special vestments and chalices to highlight the importance of this day in our liturgical and Christian life. John the Baptist and this solemnity are so important that it even takes the place of a Sunday Mass, due to the fact that

in the liturgical days ordering of days, feasts and solemnities, it ranks pretty high. Some countries, like Canada, with John as their patron saint, have even taken the day as a holiday for all people to enjoy.

Today in Luke's Gospel (yes, we take another break from the Mark's Gospel), we hear the importance of naming. It was an incredible tradition as we know and many parents go through the pattern of deciding on a special name for their child. But today, however, we hear what many of us with eyes and ears of faith know: God calls us by name and we are called to serve the God who has created us and made us wonderfully. Psalm 139 is one of my favorites, and one I often give as a penance for folks who feel down or that God is not present with them: "I praise you, for I am wonderfully made." God fashions us in the depths of God's soul and calls us into being – and for this we do not have to be fearful, but trusting that God will guide us along the paths of life.

Not only that, we are each in a way, like John the Baptist: called to point out Christ and help bring about God's ways and salvation. So, think about how and why you were named. Perhaps look up the roots of your name and learn of its interesting history and phraseology. Our parents participated in the gift of creation and baptism, which acknowledges the joys of our discipleship as a child of God.

We begin year 10 together! I returned to northeast Ohio on June 23, 2009 and began my pastorate on June 24 – a great "solemnity" day to start our journey together. (Then, you may recall I was formally installed as pastor on July 4.) What a great journey we have had together! I can't thank you enough for the care, love and support of me and the ways you have become involved in the parish's life. When I began I had 17 listening sessions and was given so many wonderful suggestions and ideas on how to improve the parish's life. We have done much together and implemented so much, including a parish plan. As we near the end of our five-year pastoral plan and

look forward to another, we give thanks to God that he has blessed our parish so much and look forward to continuing to build God's reign here. God continues to bring new life and joys to our life. May we trust the Holy Spirit to guide us to wonderful future endeavors.

July begins next Sunday: Where has the year gone? We begin a new parish fiscal year next Sunday. The Finance Council and I are grateful that you have taken seriously your stewardship, and through our "Forward in Faith, Hope & Love" campaign, have made a renewed commitment to the parish's life for the next fiscal year. Most of you were able to increase your tithing amounts. I know many of you are on fixed incomes: no matter what we give, we give to the LORD, and to increase and build the beauty of our parish. Thank you for this!

Registration: Registration is underway for the 2018-2019 PSR school year! Registration forms are available from the Parish Office and on <http://psr.saintpaschal.com> (click on "Registration Form" on the left sidebar.) For an early tuition rate, register before August 1st. Early tuition rates for this year are \$85 for 1 child, \$155 for 2 children, and \$230 for 3 or more children. **Scholarships are available.** Additionally, our registration form also serves as the emergency medical form as well as the media release form for your convenience. **Special note:** Two years of sacramental preparation is required. If you have a child entering 1st grade or 7th grade and are interested in them receiving their sacraments in 2nd and 8th grades the following year, please make sure to enroll them in PSR for this coming school year.
