In 2003, the ministry formed another group called Clown Helpers that included several parents of the younger clowns at Clowning Events. In 2004, our clown Ministry became so involved with assisting those in need, it opened up membership to all and created the Helping Hands Ministry. Clown Ministry members are trained in the art of clowning and bring smiles to the faces of the elderly, the homeless, and those in need of humor in their lives. This is not your typical volunteer-type ministry. There is a commitment of time and learning make-up, creating costumes, and other skills. The clown Ministry continues to perform in many places like nursing homes and Jesus Day, to mention a few. We would love to have more people join our Clown Ministry. 

FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



13th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Today's Gospel is filled with two healing stories of people with great faith recognizing the power of Christ. All are healed but with orders to not share this, but to feed and care for the little girl. Additionally, our second reading, from Paul's second letter to the Corinthians reminds us about how we are to "excel in every respect, in faith, discourse, knowledge, all earnestness, and in the love we have for you, may you excel in this gracious act also." The early church really had

high standards! And more than just a hope for equality and a concern for the poor, for Paul says that those with abundance gave to supply the needs of those who had less. This Christian attitude really upset the Roman leaders: Christianity advocated a radical, countercultural care that had not been witnessed or lived. I also think it is a radical, countercultural message for our times in an era where our American values, too, are at risk and eroding from some of our leaders.

As we celebrate this week our national holiday and independence, I can't help but remember the writing that appears on the bottom of a gift from France to our country: The Statue of Liberty. As a nation, as people of faith, we were known to care for the tired, the poor, and those seeking inalienable rights of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. We all have a relative here or there that didn't fill out the proper form because they could not read or write English; we had helpers. Like then, the Catholic Church was at the center of helping people assimilate into our nation, as in so many ways today. And we, as Christians, know that we can provide healing, wholeness, love and care. From the streets of Cleveland to those in our neighborhood at Villa Serena, to the far coasts of our land, let us continue to be the Christian environment of love, caring for the stranger and helping them see that God is there and with us, Emmanuel. And Christ would want us to give them something to eat!
