FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Every year, we have a break from the continuous reading of the Gospel of Mark on the 17th Sunday until the 21st Sunday for the “Bread of Life” or Eucharistic readings from the Gospel of John. Some say it’s because the Gospel of Mark is so short. I believe that when they put the lectionary together for us, they made a conscious decision to have a “Eucharistic retreat” in the middle of the liturgical year. (They could have put other readings in other weeks of the year, but they purposely chose to do it when it was done!)



So we begin our prayer time with John 6: 1-15, beginning the sixth chapter of this beloved Gospel. Jesus has many followers by this point and is caring for so many. The disciples, too, are at wits end, not having food to feed the crowd. We have all had the experience of thinking there will be not enough food and surprised to see it multiply. Rather than giving into our worries and fears, Christ wishes for us to see how other “good” may be multiplied. Perhaps if we worry and fear less, but focus more on the blessings and gifts that we have, that will help us multiply the love which we possess?

Enjoying Our Improvements: Thank you for the compliments about the campus improvements this summer, from the new signs, to the interior flooring in many places (Cry Room, parish office narthex, preschool and Jansky Learning Center to name a few). Kudos to our maintenance staff, led by Jon Detzel and the many workers who come and support us. Summer time is a special time we get a lot of things done with less on the campus.
