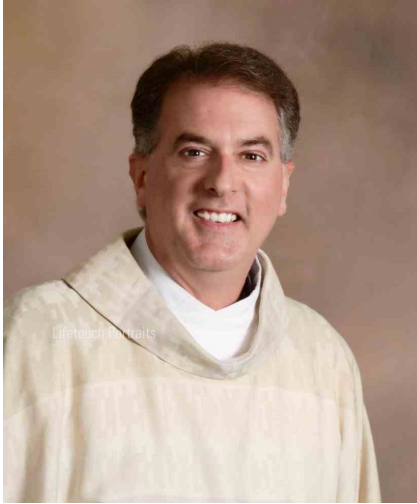

Due to the holiday and census weekend, this column was written on September 2.

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Today's Gospel reminds us of the confession of Peter and the call to take up our cross and follow Christ. Each of us has that same confession as Peter, knowing that Jesus is the Christ, and we have gratefully followed him throughout our life. It is helpful to remember the secret that goes with this acceptance of Christ. Scripture scholars call it the "Messianic Secret", for Jesus wants to make sure that all of his disciples know what's in

store before accepting the life of discipleship, or the life of the cross.

We know that cross in our lives and can name and claim it. We are called to daily lose ourselves for the sake of the Gospel. This is active faith living, the type of faith that our letter of James also reminds us this week. May we continue to take up the cross daily in our lives to demonstrate our faith, with multiple works and ways of service. It's what we do as Christian followers!

Census 2018: As we remember 65 years this month as a parish, have you had a chance to participate in the parish census, fill out the form and mail it back?

Tetelestai: For over 40 years, there has been a passion play-musical that has toured Ohio, called "Tetelestai" (tah - TELL - ah - sty), which is Greek for "It is finished," the last words in one of the Gospels that Jesus proclaims from the cross. We have hosted *Tetelestai* a few times over the history of our parish, the last time being in 2011. We were asked by the Cleveland Performing Arts Ministries to host once again in 2019. Place on your calendar the weekend of March 1 - 3. It will be a great way to prepare for Lent. (P.S. Ash Wednesday is March 6 next year.)

Questions/Answers from the "Suggestion Box": At our Pastoral Council meeting, we open the yellow suggestion box in the Fickel Narthex and review the items. Many times there are questions and I answer them to the council. This past time there were many liturgy questions and a few suggestions. Here's the answer for others to read/hear:

- ***Why can we not have bells ringing at the consecration?***
Bells were used in the past Order of Mass to alert folks, for the Mass was in Latin, that this was the time to pay attention. Now that the Mass is in the native language of people across the world, bells are only an option. We do not use them, especially due to our Eucharistic theology with a religious order dedicated to the Eucharist, because the entire Eucharistic Prayer is consecratory - not just one or two or three moments of the prayer. Otherwise, we would be ringing the bells for the seven minutes of the prayer.
- Here's a trivia note - did you know that one of the earliest Eucharistic Prayers, still used today in Iraq and Iran, does not include the words of "institution," that is, saying "This is my body, ... This is my blood?" Where would one ring a bell?

- ***Why do we need so much incense? Some people are sensitive to the smell.***
This must be an old question since during Ordinary Time we do not use incense. We train our servers to be sensitive. What can I say, they try their best!
- ***When posting hymn numbers on the board, please consider a little more space? And another one: Could we have bigger numbers for the hymn board? And another – could we get digital number boards?***
Or – sit closer? ☺ It's warmer closer to the altar and the seats are free! (On many levels!)
- ***Thank you for addressing the recent repeated scandal in the church – even though it was nothing new but a rehashing of things over 15 years ago. We appreciate when you bring current topics into the Mass. Do you think we are losing people over these news items?***
I hope not. I will admit, I have friends who are having their children stay away from church/Mass because of the scandal, saying even to my face, that I am a hypocrite for belonging to a corrupt organization. I pray for hearts to soften. I pray that people stop looking for excuses to stay away from the church. Jesus came to minister and be among sinners. We are not in heaven yet – and we have a lot of institutions to help us heal and live the Gospel. I choose to stay with and in this institution that has never claimed to be perfect, but grows daily in improving in service to God's people.
- ***Could we make our church and school a pesticide-free zone?***
We use chemicals inside or outside that do the best job and are the safest for our children and adults.
- ***Could we have another campaign to further devotion of adoration [sic] of the Eucharist? Priests used to ask people to consider this. I am disappointed to see how less & less people are attending [prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament].***
This is a great idea – and we have made the announcement over the years while I've been pastor, either after Communion or in the bulletin. We will try a sign-up weekend again soon. We just need to get the pieces together. Sadly, many of our faithful Community @ Prayer folks have gone to their eternal reward and we do not have as many "retired" members around to pray in the chapel day and night. We will continue to plug, support and invite parishioners to take an hour out of their week to pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.
- ***Can we install a holy water dispenser by the northwest church entrance?***
We actually have one – it's the baptismal font! All of our holy water comes from the same source, so please do not hesitate, like our students from school have been taught, to obtain your holy water from this sacred space.

Let's continue to pray for each other and the joy of serving in our parish's life!
