In conclusion, this is an absolutely GOD constructed ministry and has been changing lives in and out of this parish for 19 years. The ministry works because we are being obedient to our callings and in our callings we have become more willing, prayerful, useful, patient, caring, involved, communicative, passionate, hopeful and loving. I can't speak for others but I can bet they can relate to most of this article. If you don't believe me, join us and get busy. Your life will change.

SAINT PASCHAL BAYLON CATHOLIC SCHOOL NEWS

Like other Catholic schools in the state of Ohio, SPB is a member of OCSAA, the Ohio Catholic School Accrediting Association. The purpose of OCSAA is to strengthen Catholic school identity and mission, and to engage Catholic schools in the ongoing improvement of student performance. On a six year cycle, each school engages in a self-study, writes a school improvement plan, and documents the compliance of the school with the OCSAA standards. This is a critical year for us as we complete our plan and prepare for our internal and external validations. Our internal validation will take place on Tuesday, October 23. Tracey Arnone, Assistant Superintendent of Schools for the Diocese of Cleveland, will visit our school for the on-site review. This visit will be followed by a state level review later this school year and accreditation by the Commissioners of OCSAA. Our faculty has been working diligently on formulating our plan for accreditation and preparing for the upcoming reviews.

KILLING THE PAIN, NOT THE PATIENT: PALLIATIVE CARE VS. ASSISTED SUICIDE Assisted suicide is in the news and on lawmakers' agendas. Supporters call it "aid in dying" and claim it's just another option for end-of-life care. But it's radically different from the practice of palliative care, the healing art of relieving pain and other distressing symptoms for patients who are seriously ill. Palliative care intends to comfort a patient, addressing physical, psychological, emotional, and spiritual needs. Assisted suicide, by contrast, directly intends the patient's death. It ignores any underlying problems, and instead abandons and eliminates the patient who has the problems.
