Kevin went on to say that although there are other groups that come by to offer a sandwich and something to drink, it is the white Knight Rider van that they look forward to seeing without fail because of what we are able to bring to make their life just a little bit more manageable in a tough environment. A hot meal, socks, a warm jacket, blankets, shoes, batteries, tents, sleeping bags, just to name of few of the items the Knight Rider van is stocked with each and every Wednesday night. "Kevin" went on to thank us all and to remind us how important it is for these services that allow the "least of our brethren" to manage another grueling day in the cold and not so friendly environment that they must deal with every day. That short 10-minute, from the heart speech, gave each of the volunteers that night a reason to stop and think about the importance of the work the volunteers of St. Paschal Helping Hands put forth. His "Thank You" was not only to the 5 of us on the truck that night. It was to all our generous parishioners who help sort through donated clothing, cook, donate money, canned goods and clothing. 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time: “What do you want me to do for you?” To me, this is the most famous quote of Jesus and a great spiritual direction question. We know from Mark’s Gospel in today’s reading that this is in the context of Jesus being asked to cure a blind person. While he was physically blind, this question from Jesus is a helpful one for all of us as we face our own “blindness.” Eye doctors share with us that we naturally have a blind spot. The folks around us could also say that they know our blind spot. But, our question to pause and reflect on: Do we

want to see? Do we want to grow in a way that will shed light and sight to follow Christ’s way a little more thoughtfully?

There are Banners in the Sky! While I write this column on October 14, we are preparing to have our new patron saints banners placed for all of us to enjoy. This week we remember those who have gone before us, our recently named saints such as Oscar Romero, Paul VI, Catherine Kasper, etc. and those that may not be as famous such as our loved ones.
