31st Sunday in Ordinary Time: This Sunday's Gospel helps us reflect on the double commandment of loving God and our neighbor as we love ourselves. We hear from Moses and Jesus of the important distinction to love from the depths of our being.

Perhaps there is so much non-loving behavior in certain circles today due to the reality that many suffer from self-loathing. If one is not able to love oneself, it surely is a challenge to love another. Then we know others, so into loving themselves they are incapable of sharing that love with another, especially the neighbors who are so different than the other. As Richard Gaillardetz says in *Give Us This Day*, page 51 (November 2018 issue):

One cannot love God and not love one's neighbor, since the love of God is realized in large part, precisely in one's love of neighbor. This double commandment binds together the life of worship and our daily conduct toward others, and it shines a harsh light on any false piety divorced from our care for others.

Current Events: I am writing this column, as I do most columns, a week in advance of the bulletin's publication. Many times, I am two weeks ahead due to production schedules. However, as I type this column, we are hearing the horrific news (again) of another mass shooting, this time in a sacred site, a synagogue. We certainly need more loving. As we look ahead to voting this week, may we do so realizing one important aspect – as a Catholic Christian, whom do I see as loving the most and wishing for the common good? These were the principles this country was founded upon, and as followers of Christ, who is living Gospel values and not their own?

Courageous Conversations: In August I devoted bulletin columns and two homilies to the PA Attorney General's report, summarizing the Catholic Church's abuse of young people throughout the 20th century. This stirred much emotion in people again, to the point of some not even wishing to support a Catholic Church or attend worship again. While on one level that can be understandable, the sins of the past need to be addressed and conversations heard. I would like to provide a forum to discuss the clergy sexual abuse crisis, and all sins against humanity in a facilitated dialog with Rick Krivanka. Rick currently leads the Jesuit Retreat Center in Parma, but previously worked in the diocesan office of pastoral planning. Rick is no stranger to our parish, as he has led a few of our leadership/planning days for us over the years. **On Sunday, November 25, at 2:00 p.m. in the Saint Ann Shrine chapel,** we will hold a process called "Courageous Conversation" to guide those who wish to address this issue, reflect on how it has affected you, and/or further look into the care of those who are victims. Saint Ann is the grandmother of Jesus, and the protector of children. Our shrine is a special place on our campus and also a place where I hope, in our circular, flexible seating, we will take the opportunity to listen and care for one another's concerns. Let me also remind folks that on October 1 I wrote a pastoral letter addressing what steps the USCCB, the diocese and our parish take to insure a safe environment for everyone, but especially our youth. Please visit our website to read this letter.
