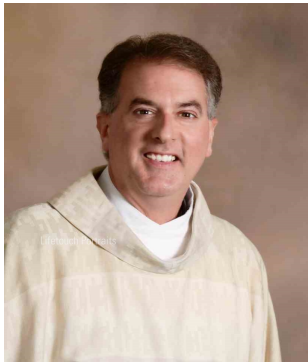
## JUST THOUGHTS FROM THE SOCIAL ACTION COMMISSION

## FROM FATHER LANE, SSS, OUR 8<sup>TH</sup> PASTOR:



**33<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time:** This is the second last Sunday of the liturgical year and we always have readings that remind us of the “end of times” on this Sunday. In fact, the liturgical year ends and begins with us focusing on the importance of reviewing our life, focusing on our mortality and our new life in Christ. Christ mentions how when the end comes the angels will gather the elect from the “four winds, from the end of the earth to the end of the sky.” The Book of Daniel also mentions the life long struggle in human history for the virtuous and the wicked.

How do we want to be known in living our life? What is the path that we have followed toward eternal life? By our baptism, we already became the “elect,” God’s chosen and holy ones. The earlier in the month celebrations of All Saints and the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed invites us to see that we are called to a faithful, hopeful life, living the Beatitudes and with Jesus, choosing a path from death to eternal life. Divine judgment will come at some point. Perhaps in our lifetime, or perhaps not! However, these weeks at the end of Ordinary Time and the beginning of Advent Time help us get in touch with the path to eternal glory. Let’s reflect on our readiness and know that God prepares us for the eternal kingdom and glory.

**Coming to Weekday Masses – Preparing for Advent:** This coming week we start a two-week weekday cycle with the Book of Revelation. It’s an exciting piece of literature, with the word meaning “apocalypse.” From 200 BCE until the end of the first century CE, there was much literature that was filled with inspiring, mystifying, terrifying and symbolic texts containing hymns, prayers and other liturgical items. I recommend coming to daily Mass to hear some of these special books of our Bible. They challenge us to consider the political, cultural and national items of their time and ours. Revelation loves to highlight the importance of prayer and communal worship. It’s because of this text and others of the first century; we know the practices of the early church.

On another note, we are winding down one liturgical year and need to start preparing for another. We start that new liturgical year on Sunday, December 2 (of course with the vigil Mass at 4:30 p.m. on Saturday, December 1 too). May I suggest some activities to “do” for Advent to increase your spirituality and liturgical practices, to deepen your faith?

- **Come to Daily Mass** – we are blessed to have 3 Masses many days and 2 Masses on Thursday & Friday. 9:00 a.m. is in the church, 11:30 a.m. in the Saint Ann Shrine and 12:15 p.m. in the church chapel.
- **Join in the Liturgy of the Hours - Morning Prayer** is at 8:00 a.m. in the church chapel and Evening Prayer at 4:45 p.m. in the same liturgical space. These are second most important prayers/worship of our church’s life. We should take part from time to time for this style helps us be in touch with the rhythm of prayer that was part of Christ’s life.
- **Enjoy an Advent Wreath at your Home Table** - and enjoy a meal together. Candles can be any color you wish – there has been a tradition of violet and white, but nothing is in the rubrics about a specific color. Many have used blue candles to distinguish from Lent and the violet color of that penitential season. Know that there are plenty of resources online, but also you can check with

George Peko in our Catechetical Office for helpful guidance, prayers and a blessing. Stock up on candles from your local discount stores and have your children say a special prayer with you together, at least one night a week!

- **Participate in Rosary, the Penance Services, Taizé and other rituals of our parish life!** Each day we have a wonderful rhythm of prayer, with items mentioned above but also our recitation of the rosary. Have you thought about having an hour of prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament? We have hours around the clock with our Community @ Prayer. We have a special routine with Taizé Eucharistic Hours too, so please schedule some prayer and quiet time for you!

**Notice the Advent-Christmas Time Schedule:** We have many parishioners who only speak and read Italian. If you are bi-lingual, please make a note to share with your friends our special times for the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent, Christmas, Holy Family Sunday and the days in between. With our many liturgical services, great- small pool of liturgical ministers, we do what we are able to have the best liturgies. See the other area in the bulletin – the calendar section, for these important items. We also sent a calendar in the mail with the tithing/offertory envelopes. Many folks did not receive this recent batch; please take note and post the schedule.

**But first... THANKSGIVING!** Let's remember the days this week too. Last week I touched on the importance of our vocation days this week, so please keep our young people and their future vocation in your prayers. Also remember our cloistered communities of nuns and monks in your prayers this Wednesday.

- Today, **Sunday, November 18 – at 3:00 p.m.** please participate in our Interfaith Thanksgiving Service at Good Shepherd Lutheran. Let's show our solidarity with our nation, our faiths and our neighbors and friends as we witness together our gratitude toward God.
- **Thursday at 9:00 a.m.,** join in our annual parish Mass, bringing a canned food item or two for our parish pantry (Helping Hands Center) and remember that the celebration continues in your home by the loaf of bread we will give you after communion, to take home a "piece of the Eucharist" to your table of gratitude, in your home or somewhere else. Let's fill up our church this Thursday with the spirit of gratitude and love for God and one another!

Thank you for your membership in our faith community! You are such a blessing and gift in my life. I give praise and thanks to God constantly for your witness in my life. I look forward to celebrate the great thanksgiving – Eucharist – with you this Thursday morning. Let us continue to pray for each other.
