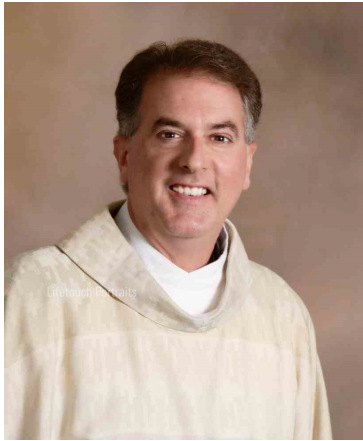

FROM FATHER LANE, SSS, OUR 8TH PASTOR:



Solemnity of Christ the King: On this last Sunday of the liturgical year, we turn once again to the annual solemnity of “Our LORD Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.” Pope John Paul II updated the title of this day in 2011 to demonstrate that all of creation focuses on the revelation of Christ as our King. After having recently binge watched “The Crown”, I became enamored by the story of Queen Elizabeth II and how she took so seriously her new role of being the monarch and wishing to exemplify the highest ideas to her people. She saw her role as being a spiritual model, and her grandmother drilled into her the importance of her being a representation of God here on earth.

The ceremony and ritual of the trial with Pilate and Christ is far different than the continued scrutiny of Queen Elizabeth II (will she retire? Will she continue to serve until her dying day, as she sees her vocation)? However, we know that Jesus’ vocation was to fulfill the Father’s will and completely represent God here on earth. Jesus did not want to make his role anything but service and to teach us to do the same. This solemnity gives us a moment to review our baptismal covenant and vocation to service. This was the culmination of Christ’s acts here on earth as the Son of God. The Risen LORD witnesses another aspect. How will this holiday remind us to be of total dedication and service to God? It’s a chance for us to take seriously our role as servant leaders.

This is a chance for folks to gather and share how this renewed crisis in the church has affected them. It will be a guided conversation, in Saint Ann Shrine, Sunday afternoon at 2:00 p.m. For those who wish, you may be anointed. We are gathering in the shrine of healing and care, from the patron saint of ultimate care and protection. We pray that lessons will be learned and transparency grow in our church’s life.

Catholic Charities Goal: We received a letter from Bishop Perez and Patrick Grace from Catholic Charities to sharing the news that we reached our goal for this year. I am so grateful to our parishioners who make this commitment to make a great difference in the lives of so many people in NE Ohio.
