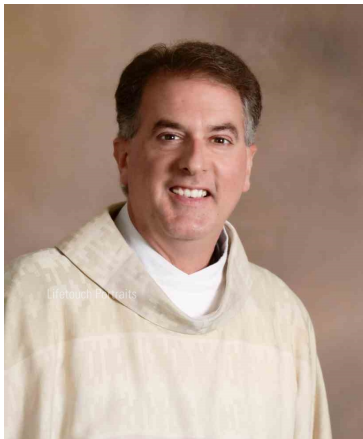

PLEASE HELP US REACH OUR GOAL!

As you know from hearing us speak at Mass, reading the bulletin, or reviewing the information we mailed out, we are continuing our “Forward in Faith, Hope and Love” Campaign. The time has come to replace and resurface our driveways and parking lots. It is something we all use, every day that we are on our campus.

Bishop Perez asked us to raise the money in advance before beginning this capital campaign and to also pay off our existing debts. Our campaign is to raise One Million Dollars. Of this, \$750,000 is for replacing the driveways and parking lots, which includes is the Blessed Sacrament kitchen parking lot, the horseshoe parking lot off Wilson Mills Road, Blue Ribbon Way(that is the driveway by the school), and our parking lots back to Green Knight Field and around the Jette Gym. \$250,000 will go toward our existing loans on the school building roofs and Saint Paschal Lane.

At the time of this publishing, we have over \$300,000 pledged – that is about 30%! However, we still need to raise the rest and are coming to you to ask for your financial assistance.

If each parish family gives \$500, we can get this done quickly and within the year! Keep in mind that a \$500 gift is about the cost of one water bottle a day, or a pizza a week. We are asking that each family give what they can. But, in this Season of Giving, we ask you to give back to your parish family.

We are appealing to you at this time so that you can take full advantage of the tax deduction or charitable distributions that may be mandatory in 2018 or the beginning of 2019. Please also know that 100% of your donation will go directly to this project!

Please pray and think about what you can contribute. You can mail your donation or drop it in the collection basket. You may also donate through myEoffering on our website. We are hoping to start the project after Spring Fling X this May.
