CLOWN/HELPING HANDS MINISTRY

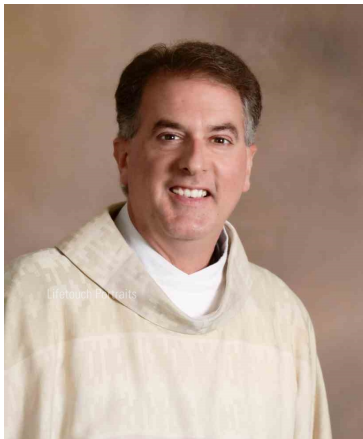

4th Sunday of Advent & Merry Christmas!

Psalm 80 reminds us today that we ask the LORD during this last day of Advent Time and Christmas Time to help us see God's face and help us turn in the correct direction in our life. These words of wisdom, in light of Mary's gift of hospitality should be helpful to us in this special holiday week. Or, you may have a family member bring you Holy Communion with a pyx; this is the ritual we do as part of the Communion Rite at each Mass when we call forth ministers to go to the homebound, nursing home or hospital.
- **Join the Blessed Sacrament Community for the Liturgy of the Hours:** Morning Prayer is at 8:00 a.m. (for 20 minutes) and Evening Prayer at 4:45 p.m. for 15 minutes.
- **Join the Community at Prayer Ministry:** Spend an hour in prayer during the day with the Blessed Sacrament in exposition or not. We have need for someone to fill the Wednesday at 3:00 p.m. timeslot and some other times too.
- **Complete Your Sacraments:** Adult folks (18 and over) who haven't received and celebrated their Confirmation. Sundays in January, between the Masses, we will have a class session. Contact George Peko.
